





Stewardship Reflection

Today's Gospel speaks to us of God's unconditional love for us and His boundless generosity. He cares for our needs in such a way that we are not only cared for, but we are given more than we could ever ask for. He does this on His own accord, of His own free will, and with His own capability. We are called to love and care for everyone as the boy with five barley loaves and three fish did. He was called upon to give what he had in order for Christ to carry out His mission of caring for every single human being.

With that mission in mind, He calls each one of us to assist Him. But He asks us to help. He wants us to help. We are called to give him all that we have; our time, our talents and our treasure, so that, together with Him, we can feed the world, offering others the love of Christ and sharing the Gospel with them.

Patris Corde (With a Father's Heart)

A Tender and Loving Father, Believer of Truth

The family went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover. On their return Jesus became separated from his parents. They first thought he was in the caravan with others. They searched for three days. When they found him, he was discussing matters of his faith with the teachers in the synagogue. Joseph and Mary expressed their concern and worry. He told them that he must be about his Father's work.

"Tenderness is the best way to touch the frailty within us. Pointing fingers and judging others are frequently signs of an inability to accept our own weaknesses. Only tender love will save us from the snares of the accuser. That is why it is so important to encounter God's mercy especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, where we experience his truth and tenderness. We know that God's truth does not condemn, but instead welcomes, embraces, sustains and forgives us. Pope Francis compared that truth always to the merciful father in the parable Jesus told of the Lost Son. Truth comes out to meet us, restores our dignity, sets us back on our feet and rejoices for us."

INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS The Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

2 Kings 4:42-44 Elisha was the successor of the great prophet Elijah, who lived about 800 years before Christ. Elisha was noted for his miraculous deeds. Today we hear of one such deed performed during a time of famine.

Ephesians 4:1-6 The first three chapters of the letter to the Ephesians teach doctrine; we now begin the next part of the letter which contains practical advice for Christian living. In today's passage, you will hear the author speak of seven ways in which Christians are united. In one sense, this is the foundation of the ecumenical movement.


