



#### INTRODUCTION FOR TODAY'S READINGS **Thirty - Third Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Daniel 12:1-3 The book of Daniel was written 150 vears before Christ, when the Jews were experiencing fierce persecution. The author wanted to encourage the people by telling heroic stories about a person named Daniel who lived many centuries earlier. For most of their history, the Old Testament people believed only in, at best, a shadowy existence after death. Today's passage contains one of the earliest references to a growing belief in a more developed form of life after death.

Hebrews 10:11-14, 18 Scholars feel that the community for which the Letter to the Hebrews was written included Christians of Jewish origin. Since the letter was written after the Jewish temple was destroyed, they were pining for the old days when the high priest offered daily sacrifices in the temple. The author says they shouldn't feel sad. They no longer need a temple, sacrifices or priests, because Jesus is all of these and more.

#### A Father in the Shadows

The Polish writer Jan Dobraczynski, in his book The Shadow of the Father, tells the story of Saint Joseph's life in the form of a novel. He uses the evocative image of a shadow to define Joseph. In his earthly relationship to Jesus, Joseph was the earthly shadow of the heavenly father: he watched over him and protected him, never leaving him to go his own way. Fathers are not born, but made. A man does not become a father simply by bringing a child into the world, but by taking up the responsibility to care for that child. Whenever a man accepts responsibility for the life of another, in some way he becomes a father to that person.

Pope John XXIII was nicknamed the Pope of St. Joseph as he always made public his devotion to St. Joseph. He described St. Joseph in this way to a large group of seminary rectors in 1961, "Meek, quiet, discreet: St Joseph is the perfect model for imitation in circumstances that recur in every age and that call for self-denial and total abandonment to God." St. Joseph was named Patron of the Second Vatican Council so that "the Council may be tranguilly prepared for and well-conducted, thus bringing abundant fruit to souls."
