




Saint Mary - Saint Michael Mission Statement

Goals of the Program




- To assist parents in their endeavors to educate their children in the Catholic Christian faith and traditions.



Attendance and Punctuality



Attendance at all classes are of vital importance since each class is built upon the foundation presented the class before. Students are asked to arrive on time for all scheduled classes. Parents should obtain missing classwork and complete it at home with their child.

Custody Considerations

We are aware that due to shared custody of children some students are not able to participate in weekly classes. We ask you to inform your child's Catechist of the situation so that they may provide you with the missed lesson plan for you to implement at home with your child.

We pray your child will attend Sunday Mass even though they are not with us for Religious Education Class on any given Sunday.

guidelines

Disciplinary Procedures Guidelines for Christian Behavior During Religious Education

The following guidelines apply to all students participating in any formation program offered by the Religious Education Ministry or by the Youth Ministry at Saint Michael the Archangel Community.

- It is expected that students be on time and prepared for learning activities when class begins. Preparation consists of the possession of assignments, writing implements and textbooks.
- All students are expected to attend every class and other grade level formation programs that are scheduled during the entire academic calendar. This includes attendance at Sunday Mass.
- In the event that a student is ill and cannot attend class, the lesson for the day is expected to be completed at home with the parent or guardian.
- All students are expected to be cooperative in class. Constant reminders to be quiet, to sit down, etc. should not be necessary. Ant student who finds it difficult to be cooperative in class should meet with the DRE to discuss the matter further. Disruptive behavior in the classroom is not acceptable in the context of a Christian learning experience.
- Students are asked to use the restroom facilities before coming to class so that time is not taken from the one-hour class. Parents are asked to alert the Catechist if a student is not feeling up to par for medical reasons.

- Christian respect for the property of others is the norm. Students are asked not to touch personal property in desks or around the classroom as well as in the hall ways. Christian behavior also implies leaving the classroom in good condition: desk in neat order, no paper on the floor and no writing on the chalkboard.
- Each student is asked to contribute to the class by not only answering direct questions, but by offering opinions of his/her own.
- Disrespectful or rude language and/ or attitude has no place in religious classrooms. Students are asked to act as if they know why they are in class: to experience Christian community, to learn about the Catholic faith, and to prepare themselves to know, love and serve God in the life.
- When conduct problems arise, a written notification will be sent home.
 This should be discussed between the parent/ guardian and child, then returned by the student at the next class with both the child's and parent's signature on it. If the student fails to reflect the basic Christian values of respect and appropriate behavior in class, they will be asked to continue their instructions at home under the supervision of their parent/ guardian.

Recognizing we all make mistakes, it is hooped that initial failures are quickly addressed once they are presented to the student and their parents. If after three meetings with the DRE, the problem cannot be corrected, the student will not be invited back into the structured program for the remainder of the year. The parish will provide the parents with the necessary material for the parent to do the instruction at home.

Homeschooling



Home based catechesis is understood as the work of Catholic parents/guardians who undertake the formal religious education of their own child(ren) for any length of time and in their it home.

Doctrinal Foundations

The Diocese of Altoona- Johnstown recognizes that the Church's teaching consistently affirms that parents are called to be the primary educators of their own children.

It is the right, therefore, to educate their children. The parish has the responsibility to support them, provide parents the necessary education to enable them to adequately form and teach the faith to their children, call them to accountability and ensure communal faith formation at the parish for the family.

Pastoral Application

Although home-based catechesis is a viable option, the words of Pope John Paul II must also be considered: "Catechesis can be given anywhere, but I wish to stress....that the parish community must continue to be the prime mover." (Catechesi Tradendale, no.67)

Parents who choose to provide the religious instruction of their own child(ren) in their own home must recognize that "Catechesis must be complete and authentic. The bishop of the diocese, the pastor of the parish, the parents, and the children all have God given responsibilities that must be respected in

considering home-based catechesis...Parents who choose...to be the primary catechist of their children must adhere to the guidelines for catechists as outlined by the diocesan bishop." (National Directory for Catechesis. No. 61)


Home-based catechesis a cooperative and collaborative effort between the parents and the parish leadership. This relationship helps parents who choose home-based catechesis to be part of the total catechetical effort of the parish and "should not feel alone in this task." (National Directory for Catechesis, no. 61)

Illness or Injury of Students



- If a student becomes ill or is injured during class time a parent will be notified via phone or text message by the DRE.
- If a child is injured in a classroom or anywhere on the campus of St. Michael
 the Archangel an Incident Report must be filled out and given to the DRE as
 soon as possible.
- DRE will then turn in a copy to the parish office so that the insurance company can be contacted.
- Parents should also receive a copy of the Incident Report

List other relevant parish activities and programs

- Eucharist Adoration is held several times during the year. Please consult the parish bulletin for dates and times.
- Stations of the Cross are held on Friday evenings during Lent.
- Wednesday evening Mass is held at Saint Mary.
- The **rosary** is recited before all Masses during the month of May and October as well as after Mass during the course of the week.
- Food drives are conducted several timed during the year.
- Camel Tree is held during Advent.
- Pancake Breakfasts are usually held once a month as a fund raiser for our twin parish in Jamaica.
- Clean up at Green Lawn Cemetery occurs in the spring and the fall seasons.
- Youth Choir for children in grades 2-8th
- Adult Choir: any student in grade 9th and up may join this group
- Altar Servers: any student from grade 4th and up
- Lectionary readers: any student from grade 2 and up
- Eucharistic Ministers: any confirmed student
- Religious Education Teacher/ Aide: any student from grade 12
- Contemporary Music Group: any interested student who plays a string instrument or who wants to sing contemporary music at Mass is invited to join.
- Musical talent to share. Play a music instrument with organist at Mass.
- Audio Visual Assistance- Audio and Video Technician. Must be in ninth grade or higher.
 Training will be provided.

Safety Policies and Procedures including Safe Environment Policies/ Lessons

Providing a safe environment for all parish programs is essential for the well being of all as well as providing an environment conductive to education and formation in faith. Within reasonable care safe environments can be provided for catechists, volunteers and children/youth.

- Any employee or volunteer participating in children/youth programing is to complete the requirements for diocesan training, clearances and documents for the Office of Children and Youth Protection before assuming any responsibilities.
- People not participating in a program or activity should not have access to children/youth.
- Children in PreK through second grade are not to be dismissed until a parent or older sibling picks them up at the classroom door.
- All programs and building are to be monitored.
- Catechist, volunteers and children/youth should be familiar with the location of exits and fire extinguishers.
- An annual fire drill.
- Each building used for programing should have at least two exits.
- Safe environment lessons will be given to all grades levels at least once a year and a report is to be sent to the Office of Youth Protection.

Service Component of the Program



- Service is a very essential part of our Catholic Christian tradition.
 All grade levels are expected to do at least one service project and reflection afterwards.
- Those in the Confirmation process are to complete 10 hours of group service hours and 15 individual service hours each of the three years of the process. A reflection is to accompany the service hours.

SERVICE

The life and ministry of Jesus are the source of Christian service and the example that we must follow. His love and compassion become our pattern for love and compassion. It is in following the example of Jesus that we are drawn into service.

Service is an essential part of living out our baptismal call as a Catholic Christian. Christian service properly understood is the automatic response to the dictates of the Gospel when it is properly proclaimed and explained. To help students experience what it means to live the faith, service and reflection upon the service is required for all students in Catechetical Formation.

Parents provide the first model of service for their children. The way in which they care for their children and others and participate in the parish and community teach their children by example basic Gospel values. Parents are encouraged at all levels to participate in the service required of their child.

The parish, under the guidance of the clergy, will call children and youth to an active participation in its life and ministry. Service that flows from parish sacramental life and the Gospel mandate is appropriate for and expected from all of its members. Children and youth have a vitality and newness of vision that is vital to a vibrant faith-filled community and must be encouraged.

The catechist will broaden the vision of service provided by the parents and parish. Concerns related to issues of peace and justice are integrated throughout the curriculum. Teaching these issues often leads to action. The catechist is expected to be a catalyst for age appropriate activities.

Service must be affirming and worthwhile to the person performing it if discipleship is to be understood. Children and youth are encouraged to go beyond their normal boundaries and be given a vision of self and communal service that stretches them to this discipleship. We need the encourage children and youth to develop and share their gifts and talents to participate in the mission of the church.

Encourage students to perform acts of service in the home, parish, community and to have a global awareness. Service needs to be both a normal part of daily life as well as performed through organized programs. Individual service will provide students the opportunity to work as a part of their daily life in a particular area of interest. Group service will help students work together with others toward a common goal of the parish or community in an organized program.

Allowing older grades to come up with group service projects for the parish or community on their own (with a catechists help) can sometimes make them feel more invested in the project than just telling them when to show up and where.

Reflection is an important component for any service if it is to help students grow into mature Christians. This may be accomplished in a group setting or in the case of older students, by journal writing. Whatever the method chosen, the student needs: to state their experiences, reflect on the impact of the service to their faith formation and name important events that happened during the service.

Procedure for communication with parents/guardians



Flock Note will be used to send reminders of up coming events, schedule changes, and cancellations.

Student will not directly receive any form of written communication from an adult catechist, youth minister or staff member unless we have the parent's permission and the correspondence is also sent to the parent.

Respect for Persons & Property



Christian respect for the property of others is the norm. Students are asked not to touch personal property in desks or around the classrooms as well as in the hallways. It also implies leaving the classroom in good condition: desk in neat order, no paper on the floor and no writing on the chalk board or smart board.

No form of Bulling is allowed at any time.

Disrespect or rude language and or attitude has no place in Religious Education classrooms. Students are asked to act as if they know why they are in class: to learn about the Catholic Faith and to prepare themselves to know, love and serve God in their life.

Registration and Program Fees

Registration takes place on line before the first of August. We encourage families to register at this time to give us amble time to prepare class for the first class. **ALL** students who are preparing for a sacrament are to register. The fee is \$25 per student in all programs except Pre-K; they are free.

Sacramental Preparation Guidelines



According to Diocesan Directives, sacramental preparation for Baptism, First Eucharist, Confirmation and Reconciliation is to be family oriented and parish based (Directive #4). Whatever the parish requires for sacramental preparation for the sacraments is expected of those who are home-schooled.

ALL students who attend Catholic Schools are to attend parish base preparation classes as required by the diocese. It is your parish that is responsible to assist you in preparing for sacraments not your school.
