

Cloning with Photoshop (Environmental Portrait)

- Open all of your images in Photoshop File > Open
- Choose 1 photo, Select All Select > All (CTRL + A)
- Copy Edit > Copy (CTRL + C)
- Choose a different photo, Paste Edit > Paste (CTRL + V)
*You will see a new layer appear in the Layers Window.
Make sure you have the top layer selected.*
- Create a Layer Mask Layer > Layer Mask > Reveal All
- Use the ERASER tool to erase out the area where your figure is in the LAYER BELOW it.
Use the eyeball tool to reveal the lower layers if necessary.
- FLATTEN the image Layer > Flatten Image
*You should now see the 2 layers become 1.
Use this image to copy into another photograph.*
- Select All Select > All (CTRL + A)
- Copy Edit > Copy (CTRL + C)
- Choose a different photo, Paste Edit > Paste (CTRL + V)
*You will see a new layer appear in the Layers Window.
Make sure you have the top layer selected.*
- Create a Layer Mask Layer > Layer Mask > Reveal All
- Use the ERASER tool to erase out the area where your figure is in the LAYER BELOW it.
Use the eyeball tool to reveal the lower layers if necessary.
- FLATTEN the image Layer > Flatten Image
You should now see the 2 layers become 1.
- Repeat the same process until all of your images are layered into one document.
Select All > Copy > Paste > Layer Mask > Eraser > Flatten the image
- Save your final image as a **.jpg file** in the One Drive folder.
