

THE KEY TO PROPHETIC IMAGERY: A SCRIPTURAL STUDY COMPLIANT WITH THE KING JAMES VERSION

In the study of biblical prophecy, a foundational axiom remains: Scripture must interpret Scripture. The prophetic visions recorded by the prophets and apostles do not rely on private human speculation. Instead, they employ an internal, coherent lexicon where mysterious symbols map directly to literal historical realities. Consider a dramatic prophetic scene: From the turbulent waters of the great sea (representing large multitudes of peoples, nations, and tongues as defined in Revelation 17:15), the winds of war and political strife (Jeremiah 49:36) break forth. Out of this geopolitical chaos, a terrifying beast arises. According to Daniel 7:17, this beast is not a literal monster but an empire or a major world kingdom. She is clothed in fine white linen, which is explicitly defined as the righteousness of the saints (Revelation 19:8). She stands firmly anchored upon the Rock, which is Jesus Christ (1 專 Corinthians 10:4), sheltered beneath His protective truth like a shield and buckler (Psalm 91:4). Conversely, an apostate and unfaithful church system is depicted as a corrupt woman or harlot, arrayed in scarlet and crimson—colors signifying deep sin, corruption, and bloodguiltiness (Isaiah 1:18, Revelation 17:4-5). This corrupt system holds a golden cup full of abominations, passing around her intoxicating wine, which represents false doctrines and spiritual confusion that intoxicate the inhabitants of the earth (Revelation 17:2).

The divine timeline of these movements is tracked using prophetic measures. A single day in a symbolic timeline translates directly to a literal year of history (Ezekiel 4:6), meaning a prophetic week amounts to seven literal years (Daniel 9:27). Throughout these eras, God sends his word as a lamp and candle to guide the feet of the faithful (Psalm 119:105), sharper than any two-edged sword (Ephesians 6:17). The Holy Spirit is poured out like rain (Deuteronomy 32:2) and oil (Isaiah 61:1), preparing a spiritual vineyard (Isaiah 5:7) for the final harvest at the end of the world (Matthew 13:39). When the Son of man finally returns upon the clouds of heaven with a sharp sickle to execute final judgment (Daniel 7:13, Joel 3:13), the ungodly will be blown away like chaff (Psalm 1:4) or consumed by fire and brimstone (Psalm 11:6).
