- G. Director of Liaison and Special Projects Neal Fausset
 - Addressed the rule changes and would like Colorado HS soccer rules to be more closely aligned with the FIFA Laws of the Game.

- B. Other New Business.
 - i. Guest Presentation by Joe Solarte
 - Coaches feedback regarding Referee Crews use of Communication Devices has been positive. Ex: Kent Denver HC felt comms were very useful though they still received the same overall quality of assigned referees from their Assignor.
 - Comms can also provide an educational aspect for a match assignment. Ex: Create a select group of 100 Level Referees to start a Mentor Program. Instant in-game feedback for a developing Referee through an assigned Mentor Assistant Referee
 - Recommend to Schools and/ or Districts (ex: common site district stadium) to purchase a site specific Comms System to be used by assigned crews rather than relying on Referees to purchase systems on their own. Possibly HSSO can purchase a set (or few sets) for educational training and/or Camps.

- ii. Recommendation to CHSAA & HSSO to consider allowing High School players to sign up to referee in the cross-over season as "JV / C-Level only" referees. Possibly help build the Referee membership within HSSO even though not allowed to referee Varsity level if still enrolled in High School. Possibly offer a "discounted" rate with HSSO which would still provide CHSAA and Insurance coverage. More training and educational opportunities will also occur if convinced to join USSF.
- iii. Overall Season remarks from Ken Hehir
 - Coaches have been mostly happy with the transition to the Diagonal System of Control though less happy with the general crew assignments. Using Rankings can help Assignors with this aspect.
 - Continue to have occurrences of Varsity level matches having a crew of 2 instead of 3; either a shortage of referees, too many games on certain nights, last minute changes by Assignors, etc. Schools unhappy with last minute changes from Assignors which moves the 3rd to a different site reducing the crew to 2.
 - 3. Overall the Playoff assignments went well. There were a significant number of issues with entered availability (or blocks) within Arbiter which lead to many turnback / declines on playoff matches.
 - 4. Request the Colorado Referee Committee to allow HSSO to present during the upcoming CSA / CRC Annual General Meeting in January to help promote HSSO & CHSAA membership. Training Sessions/Meetings within HSSO for the entire state can be merged with CRC.
