### OSHAWA-BASED UNIT LEADS MAJOR ARMY EXERCISE

September 9, 2024 – Ottawa, Ont. – National Defence / Canadian Armed Forces The Ontario Regiment, RCAC recently led a major Armoured Cavalry training event at Garrison Petawawa, where soldiers and units from across Ontario gathered to conduct simulated combat operations. The focus of the event was the culmination of a specialized leadership program which saw 22 Canadian Army soldiers from across 4th

Canadian Division (headquartered in Toronto) successfully complete their course during CAMP WORTHY from August 16-30, 2024. Activities included honing armoured cavalry tactics, techniques and procedures, participating in simulated combat operations in the dismounted role, vehicle-mounted live-fire and manoeuvring, armoured reconnaissance, and leadership training within realistic battlefield conditions.

The 22 graduates of the Canadian Army Rank Qualification Master Corporal course are now qualified vehicle Crew Commanders, where they will stand ready to lead detachments of soldiers in maneuver-based warfare. While these candidates were being assessed, an excellent opportunity was also available to other ranks to practice vehicle operations, weapons drills, and communications in an intense environment.

Although all Canadian Army members train regularly and maintain specialized qualifications and proficiency in safe and effective weapons use and vehicle operations, this was an extended period of training where they constantly practiced discipline, safety, and effectiveness on various vehicles, and dismounted on foot.

"We were extremely proud to lead CAMP WORTHY this year, where leaders of tomorrow's Armoured Cavalry were challenged and proven. Bringing this course into the

Petawawa RTA under this training model provided excellent opportunities for our soldiers to test their leadership, mobility and adaptability in challenging conditions, while ensuring we're ready to support overseas deployments." #### Suspect in Help Solve a Crime Sexual Assault Arrested

Investigators have arrested the suspect in a sexual assault that occurred near Durham College in Oshawa. On Wednesday, August 28, 2024, at approximately 1:10 p.m., a male sat beside a female on a bench while she was waiting for a bus in the bus loading area, near the main entrance to Durham College, located at 2000 Simcoe Street North. The suspect groped the victim as she was about to get on the bus. The suspect then followed the victim onto the bus and attempted to sit with her, however she was able to sit near the driver for safety, before contacting police. Investigators identified the suspect and on Friday, September 13, 2024, took him into custody. Ved Pratikbhai PATEL, age 19 from Oshawa is charged with: Sexual Assault, and Criminal Harassment.
