## Body Found by Side of the Road Deemed Suspicious Death

The body of a deceased male was located on Stevenson Road North in Oshawa has been deemed a suspicious death and the Homicide Unit is investigating.

On Wednesday, March 13, 2019 at approximately 8:10 a.m., a City of Oshawa employee driving on Stevenson Road North just south of Raglan Road West in north Oshawa observed a body on the west side of the road. When he got a closer look and confirmed it was a deceased male, he called police.

Officers attended and confirmed it was the body of an adult male with obvious signs of trauma. Members of the Homicide Unit and Forensics were called to the scene and the road was closed. Investigation is now underway to determine the identity of the male.

## Suspect Wanted for a Subway Store Robbery in Oshawa

Investigators are trying to identify a suspect involved in a commercial store robbery Monday night in Oshawa.

On Monday, March 11, 2019, at approximately 10:50 p.m., members of Central East

Division responded to a robbery at the Subway store on King Street East. A lone suspect entered the store armed with a knife. The suspect made his way to the cash register and made a demand for cash. The suspect then ran northbound from the store.

K-9 and uniform officers searched the area with negative results.

No physical injuries were reported.

The suspect is described as male, black, 5'8" to 5'10" tall, medium build, approximately 20-22 years old. He was wearing a black winter jacket, grey scarf over his face, dark grey pants, black winter cap and black shoes. He was armed with a knife.

## Man Arrested for Fraud at a Pickering Bank

A Niagara region man, posing as a Calgarian, was arrested for fraud in Pickering.

Investigators are crediting alert employees at a Scotiabank branch for unravelling the pending fraud attempt. On Saturday, March 9, 2019 at approximately 9:40 a.m., officers were called to the Scotiabank branch at the Pickering Town Centre. A male entered the bank and wanted to open an account and get a credit card. He provided a driver's license from

Alberta as proof of his identity. An alert employee checked the validity of the document and found it to be fraudulent. Police were called while the man was in the bank and he was arrested by responding officers, without incident.

Officers seized the fake Alberta driver's license and multiple debit/credit cards, cash and several gift cards.

## Suspect Arrested After Fleeing from Police in Whitby

Officers arrested a male, with the help of Air1, after he failed to stop for police in Whitby Saturday evening.

At approximately 12:15 a.m., on Saturday, March 9, 2019, a Duty Inspector attempted to stop a vehicle near Brock Street and Dundas Street in Whitby. The suspect who was operating a grey four door Chevrolet, failed to stop and drove off at a high rate of speed in nearby residential streets, losing the officers. The suspect was then observed by Air1 in the area

of Beech Street and officers took the suspect into custody. The suspect attempted to flee from arresting officers, but was taken into custody.

**Berek COX**, age 34 of Greenvalley Trail in Oshawa, is charged with: Assault with Intent to Resist Arrest; Operate a Conveyance While Prohibited; Flight from Police; Fail to Comply with Probation Order x4 and Operation While Impaired.

## Woman on Scooter Struck by Vehicle

An Oshawa woman riding a mobility scooter escaped with only minor injuries after being struck by a vehicle at an intersection and thrown about 10 feet. On Friday, March 8, 2019, at approximately 9:30 a.m., police were called to the intersection of Mary Street North and Taunton Road East regarding a pedestrian collision. An Oshawa woman in her 50s was riding on her mobility scooter northbound on Mary Street and crossing Taunton Road on the crosswalk with a green light. A vehicle entered the intersection travelling southbound and was turning eastbound onto Taunton when the collision occurred. The female in the scooter was thrown approximately 10 feet due to the force of the collision. She was taken to hospital and tests later revealed she suffered no major injuries. The 43-year-old female driver of the red Chevrolet Cruze was given a ticket under the Highway Traffic Act for Careless Driving. Bright sunshine was a factor in the collision.

## Break and Enter Suspects Wanted

Investigators are trying to identify two suspects who broke into a Tim Hortons store in Oshawa after hours.

On Saturday, March 9, 2019, at approximately 3:00 a.m., two males broke into the Tim Hortons store on King Street at Drew Street in Oshawa. A lone employee inside the store, the baker, fled out the front door and called police. The suspects stole a quantity of cash from the tills and fled southbound on Drew Street.

Officers arrived and searched the area, including a K-9 team, however no arrests were made. Investigators are hoping the public can help identify the two suspects.

Suspect #1 is described as a male, about 5'9" tall, medium build, wearing spring jacket, camouflage pants and tan boots. Suspect #1 is described as a male, about 5'8" tall, medium build, wearing a camouflage hoodie with a black and grey jacket, dark pants and running shoes.

sion involving a four-wheeled All-Terrain Vehicle (ATV) in Scugog.

On Saturday, March 9, 2019, at approximately 1:22 a.m., officers from North Division were called to a serious motor vehicle collision involving an ATV in the vicinity of Chandler Drive and The Mississauga's Trail. The male operating the ATV appeared to have lost control and was thrown from the off-road vehicle. The male was not wearing a helmet at the time. First responders attended the scene and provided medical assistance to the male. He was transported to a local hospital then air-lifted to a Toronto-area trauma hospital with life-threatening injuries. At this time, the male remains in stable but critical condition.

## Traffic Stop Leads to Drug Charges

A 26-year-old Oshawa man is facing charges after he was found driving with an open can of beer and in possession of drugs. On Tuesday, March 5, 2019, in the area of Taunton Road West and Stevenson Road North in Oshawa, officers conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle with expired license plates. When the officer approached the vehicle, he noticed a strong odor of cannabis. Upon further investigation, an open can of beer was found as well as cannabis and cocaine. The street value of the drugs totaled more than \$20,000.

**Damien Dionne**, age 26 of Paddington Court in Oshawa, is charged with Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking (cocaine); Possession for the Purpose of Selling (cannabis); Adult Possess Over 30 Grams (cannabis); Possession for the Purpose of Distributing (cannabis); Drive Motor Vehicle - No License; Drive Motor Vehicle - No Validation or Plate; Fail to Have Insurance Card; Drive Motor Vehicle with Liquor Readily Available; and Drive Vehicle with Cannabis Readily Available.

## Suspects Attempt to Lease a Car Using Fraudulent Identification

A 31-year-old male from Toronto is facing charges after he attempted to use a fraudulent identification to attempt to lease a vehicle.

On Friday, January 25, 2019, the male suspect and an unknown female attended the BMW dealership in Ajax. He had made arrangements with a Whitby resident to take over a car lease. While filling out the paper work at the dealership, the suspect provided identification. The dealership employee felt the ID was fake and confronted the two. The suspects left the scene. Police were called and an investigation commenced. The suspect was identified and subsequently arrested without incident.

**Errol PEYNADO**, age 31 of Platinum Drive in Toronto, has been charged with Fraud Over \$5,000, Personation, Possess Identity Document and Posses Counterfeit Mark.

## Shooting Incident in Oshawa

A 30-year-old male is facing charges in connection to a shooting that occurred in December 2018.

On Monday, December 10, 2018, at approximately 5 a.m., officers were called to a Toronto Avenue residence near Ritson Road South in Oshawa regarding a 50-year-old male who had been shot. An investigation commenced and the suspect was eventually identified.

On Friday, March 8, 2019, officers attended a residence in Ajax after receiving information that the suspect was inside. Officers observed the male exit the residence and he was taken into custody. He was found in possession of a handgun.
