Suspect #3 is described as: male, 5'7" tall, wearing beige pants, black shoes, grey/white camo hooded jacket, and black baseball cap. His face was covered.

Two masked males armed with knives robbed an Ajax pizza store.

Fatal Collision in Clarington

A 31-year-old Nestleton woman was fatally injured in a head-on collision overnight in Clarington.

On Thursday, May 9, 2019, at approximately 9:36 p.m., members of East Division responded to a head-on collision involving two vehicles.

According to witnesses, a white GMC Sierra was travelling southbound on Bowmanville Avenue just north of Taunton Road when it veered into the northbound lane, striking a blue Jeep Cherokee. The 31-year-old female driver sustained fatal injuries and was found without vital signs. The passenger of the Jeep, a 35 year-old male from Scugog, suffered serious injuries. He was transported to a Toronto-area trauma hos-

pital where he remains in stable condition. There were two dogs in the vehicle, one of which had to be euthanized due to its injuries. Another dog was taken to an animal hospital with serious injuries. The driver of the GMC Sierra, a 60-year-old Scugog male sustained non-life threatening injuries and was transported to a trauma unit in Toronto, he remains in stable condition.

Members of the DRPS - Collision Investigation Unit, attended the scene to conduct an investigation. The area of the roadway was closed for several hours while evidence was collected.

Ajax Bank Robbery

The two suspects charged with robbing banks in Ajax and Hamilton are now facing additional charges as a result of further investigation.

Michael CHRISTOPHER, age 20, of Etobicoke, Ontario has been additionally charged with a bank robbery that occurred in Grimsby Ontario on February 27, 2019. A 16-year-old male from Mississauga has also been charged in relation to this incident. The same 16-year-old male has also been charged with an additional robbery that occurred on February 23, 2019 in Kitchener Ontario. A second 16-year-old male from Brantford, Ontario has been charged in relation to this incident.

ARSON INVESTIGATIONS IN OSHAWA AND WHITBY

Two separate residential fires Wednesday morning have been deemed suspicious, one in Oshawa and another in Whitby.

On Wednesday, May 8, 2019, at approximately 6:30 a.m., members from Central West Division were dispatched to a residential fire on Pennine Drive in Whitby to assist with traffic control. The fire was

extinguished and the fire was deemed suspicious by the Office of the Ontario Fire Marshall. There were no injuries reported.

At approximately 7:30 a.m., members of Central East Division responded to an abandoned home on Wilson Road South in Oshawa for a fully engulfed home. The fire was extinguished and the fire was deemed suspicious by the Office of the Ontario Fire Marshall. No one was physically hurt as a result of the fire. Both fire investigations are ongoing and separate. There is nothing to suggest they are related. Investigators will be canvassing the areas and going through surveillance cameras to get suspect information.

Stabbing Incident in Oshawa

An Oshawa male was sent to hospital after being stabbed outside a residence in Oshawa.

On Thursday, May 2, 2019, at approximately 2:30 a.m., members of Central West Division responded to a stabbing on Chevron Prince Path in Oshawa. The male victim, a 27-year-old, was involved in an altercation with other parties when he was stabbed. The two suspects fled the scene prior to police arrival. The male victim was taken to a local hospital with critical injuries and later transferred to a Toronto-area trauma centre. Police were able to locate a suspect at a nearby residence and he was taken into custody by the Tactical Support Unit.

William DONOVAN, age 22 of Toronto, is charged with Aggravated Assault, Assault with a Weapon and Weapons Dangerous.

Suspects Wanted for Knife-Point Robbery in Ajax

Police are looking for two suspects after a Chinese food store was robbed in Ajax Saturday night.

On Saturday, May 11, 2019, at approximately 10:50 p.m., members of West Division were dispatched to a robbery call at the Oriental Kitchen on Kingston Road in Ajax. Police arrived and the clerk indicated two males entered the store, one was armed with a knife. The suspects grabbed an undisclosed amount of money from the cash register and ran on foot. Police searched the area with negative results.

The employees were not physically harmed during the incident.

Suspect #1 is described as: male, black, approximately 6' tall, medium build. He was wearing a black baseball cap, black jacket and pants. He wore a mask to conceal his identity and was armed with a knife.

Suspect #2 is described as: male, black, 6' tall, medium build and wearing black clothes.

Investigation in Oshawa Deemed a Homicide

Homicide investigators have deemed the death of an elderly female at an apartment in Oshawa as suspicious and have begun an investigation. On Sunday, May 12, 2019, at approximately 7:10 p.m., members from Central East Division responded to an apartment fire on Nonquon Road in Oshawa. Oshawa Fire Services quickly extinguished the fire and found an elderly female inside with injuries. The 83-year-old female was taken to a local hospital where she later succumbed to her injuries. Homicide investigators were called to the scene and they took carriage of the investigation.

A 56-year-old male was arrested a short time later in

connection with the death of the 84-year-old female.

This is an ongoing investigation and there will be more information to follow. This is the fifth homicide in Durham Region.

Suspects Wanted For Gas Station Robbery in Bowmanville

Police are looking for three suspects after a gas station robbery in Bowmanville.

On Friday, May 10, 2019, at approximately 2:30 a.m., members of East Division were dispatched to a robbery call at the Shell gas station on Liberty Street in Bowmanville. Police arrived and the clerk indicated three males broke the glass, unlocked the door and entered with garbage bags. The door was locked for security reasons. One was armed with a small hammer. They filled up the bags before fleeing the store on foot and were last seen turning right onto Ann Street. Police checked the area with negative results. The clerk was not

entered the Pizza Pizza store on Westney Road South in Ajax. Both were brandishing knives and they threatened the employees and demanded money. They received a quantity of cash and fled out of the store, last seen heading northbound on Harwood Avenue.

Officers arrived and searched the area, but no arrests were made.

Suspect #1 is described as a male, white, about 6 feet tall, 200 lbs., medium build, wearing a blue windbreaker over top of a black-hooded sweatshirt, black shorts and black shoes.

Suspect #2 is described as a male, black, about six feet tall, 190 lbs., with a medium build, wearing a black-hooded sweater and black pants.
