TWO TEENS INJURED IN A SHOOTING IN OSHAWA

Two teens suffered serious injuries after a shooting in Oshawa on Monday morning. On Monday, April 5, 2021, at approximately 12:20 a.m., members of Central East Division responded to a double shooting behind the Glen Street Public School in Oshawa. Police located a 17-year-old male and a 19-year-old male with serious injuries from shots being fired. The victims were transported to a Toronto area trauma centre with serious but non-life threatening injuries. Information received as part of the investigation, indicates there was an altercation between the victims and two other males on the basketball court which resulted in the two teens being shot. Investigators don't believe this was a random act. Police are looking for a suspect who fled from the scene. There are no descriptors at this time and the investigation is ongoing.

CELLPHONE STORES ROBBED IN AJAX AND BOWMANVILLE

Five suspects are wanted for the robbery of a cellphone store in Bowmanville last Wednesday afternoon. On Wednesday, March 31, 2021, at approximately 4:10 p.m., members of East Division responded to a robbery at a Rogers store on Regional Road 2 in Bowmanville. The suspects, who were armed with knives and screwdrivers robbed the store of cash and cellphones before fleeing in a Ford Explorer. There were no physical injuries reported by staff. Police spotted the vehicle travelling on Highway 401 and attempted to stop the vehicle. Police pursued the vehicle, but later discontinued following the vehicle for public safety concerns. Robbery investigators are also investigating a cell-phone robbery at the Rogers store on Westney Road in Ajax at 3:30 p.m. It is believed that the suspects in this incident are also responsible for the

Bowmanville robbery. There are no suspect descriptors at this time. The vehicle is described as a dark Ford Explorer. Anyone with new information about this investigation is asked to contact

SUSPECT WANTED IN OSHAWA FIREARM INVESTIGATION

Investigators are looking for the public's assistance to identify an armed male who attended an Oshawa plaza last Friday. On Friday, March 19, 2021, at approximately 11:55 p.m., a dark Ford Focus pulled into a plaza at Mary Street North and Nonquon Road, in Oshawa. The suspect exited the rear passenger seat of the vehicle, followed by a female. The female walked towards the store as words were exchanged. The male pulled out a handgun, racked it and pointed the gun at the female. Both the male and female got back into the vehicle which drove off southbound on Mary Street North. The male holding the handgun is described as white, possibly 25-years-old, he wore a dark coat with fur on hood, a grey hoodie and jeans. He was armed with a firearm.

The driver of the vehicle is male, white, wearing a black and red coat. The front passenger is male, white, wearing a black t-shirt. The vehicle is possibly a 2017 black Ford Focus. It has two large grey stripes along the hood and roof of the vehicle. There is a red addition to the front bumper below the licence plate.

DRIVER CHARGED AFTER ROAD RAGE INCIDENT IN BOWMANVILLE

Investigators have charged a 36-year-old female in a road rage incident that occurred in Bowmanville in early March. On the evening of

Wednesday, March 10, 2021, members of East Division were called to a driving complaint in the area of Apple Blossom Boulevard in Bowmanville. The officer spoke to the involved parties and there were no charges laid based on the information received at that time. The investigating officer received additional dash-cam video evidence from other witnesses several days later and based on this new evidence, the 36-year-old female driver of Bowmanville has been charged with Careless Driving.

SUSPECT ARRESTED IN COUNTERFEIT CURRENCY INVESTIGATION

A Toronto resident faces numerous charges after a fraud investigation resulted in the seizure of counterfeit money, equipment and documents.

Investigators from the DRPS Financial Crimes Unit commenced a fraud investigation after the suspect made numerous online purchases with counterfeit money. The suspect contacted sellers through online platforms using the Facebook name of (Positive Vibez or DBG Sun-Rah) and purchased items from them using counterfeit bills. Members of the Financial Crimes Unit identified the suspect and executed a search warrant at an address on Camperdown Avenue in Toronto. The suspect was arrested and police seized counterfeit currency, counterfeit equipment, documents, and drugs (crystal meth, cocaine, fentanyl).

David BUENDIA-GUZMAN, age 38, of Camperdown Avenue in Toronto, faces 17 criminal fraud-related charges including: Possession of a Schedule I Substance; Possess Identity Document of Another x9; Possess Government Paper; Unlawfully Possess Counterfeit Mark and Make Counterfeit Money.

INDECENT ACT IN AJAX

Investigators are trying to identify a male who was seen committing an indecent act near the Waterfront Trail in the area of Shoal Point Road and Ashbury Boulevard in Ajax. On Saturday, March 27, 2021 at approximately 12:00 p.m., a male was observed committing an indecent act by witnesses near the Waterfront Trail at Shoal Point Rd. and Ashbury Blvd. in Ajax. The suspect is described as a male, white, in his 50's with very short or shaved grey hair. He was wearing a jacket with red markings and dark pants.

DRIVER CHARGED AFTER PEDESTRIAN STRUCK IN OSHAWA

A 40-year-old Oshawa female pedestrian was seriously

injured in a motor vehicle collision in Oshawa.

On Thursday, March 25, 2021, at approximately 3:37 p.m., members of Central East Division responded to a single motor vehicle collision that had pinned a woman between a vehicle and a commercial premise in the area of Malaga Road and Park Road in Oshawa.

Police received reports that the involved vehicle, a 2021 black Chevrolet Silverado pickup truck was westbound on Malaga Road when the vehicle suddenly left the roadway and struck the female pedestrian in the parking lot of a commercial lot pinning her against the north wall of the building.

The 40-year-old female pedestrian was rushed to a Toronto trauma center with critical injuries and she remains in stable but critical condition.

The driver of the pick-up truck, **Philip NICHOLLS** age 57, of Whitby, was arrested and charged with Impaired Operation of a Conveyance Causing Bodily Harm and Operate Conveyance 80 Milligrams or Above/

SUSPECTS ARRESTED AFTER SHOOTING IN OSHAWA

Four male suspects are facing numerous charges after a shooting in Oshawa.

On Friday, March 19, 2021 at approximately 12:15 p.m., a 22-year-old male from Oshawa entered the local hospital in Oshawa suffering from a gunshot wound. Police were called and investigators attended the hospital and spoke with the victim who had non-life-threatening injuries. The victim told police he was walking in a residential area near Birchcliffe Avenue and Lakeview Park Avenue, in Oshawa when he was shot. Investigators executed a search warrant at a residence of Birchcliffe Avenue in Oshawa. During the search warrant, investigators seized approximately \$8,500 in cash, \$46,000 in drugs (cocaine and fentanyl), a loaded firearm and a rifle.

Garey JOHNSON, age 49, from Birchcliffe Avenue in Oshawa, **Reshane HARRIOTT**, age 27, from Birchcliffe Avenue in Oshawa, **Trey JOHNSON**, age 24, from Rathburn Street in Mississauga, and **Dante JOHNSON**, age 20, from Dominy Drive in Ajax are facing numerous firearms and drug related charges. Investigators don't believe that this was a random act.

FOUR VEHICLE COLLISION IN WHITBY

A 34-year-old male was seriously injured after being involved in a motor vehicle collision in Whitby on Thursday morning. On Thursday, March 18, 2021 at approximately 9:40 a.m.,

members of Central West Division, were called to Lake Ridge Road South and Dundas Street West in Whitby for a report of a motor vehicle collision involving four vehicles.

The motor vehicle operated by the 34-year-old male incurred severe damage after the collision. Emergency Services attended the scene and extricated the male from the vehicle. He suffered serious injuries and was transported to a trauma hospital in Toronto where he remains in stable condition. He was the lone occupant in the vehicle. Two drivers from the other motor vehicles reported minor injuries and were transported to a local hospital.

SUSPECT ARRESTED AFTER SHOOTING IN PICKERING

Investigators have arrested a 74-year-old male after discharging a firearm into a commercial premise in early March.

On Tuesday, March 2, 2021, members were called to the Meridian Credit Union on Kingston Road in Pickering after damage was found to a window, door and computer inside the store as a result of a gunshot. The store was closed when the shots were fired and there were no injuries. Police began an investigation and arrested the suspect whom lived in the vicinity of the Credit Union. Police seized several firearms from a residence.

Martin LEE, age 74 of Pickering, faces several firearm-related charges including: Possession of Firearm No License; Discharge Firearm into a Place; Possession Weapon-Dangerous to Public Peace; Transport Firearm; Careless Storage of a Firearm; Possession of a Firearm Knowing its Possession was Illegal and Possession of a Loaded Firearm.

TWO SUSPECTS WANTED IN TWO COMMERCIAL ROBBERIES

Investigators continue their efforts to identify two male suspect after two commercial robberies in Oshawa and Ajax in mid-February.

Surveillance images are being released of two male suspects in an effort to identify them. It is also believed that the suspects fled in a dark coloured SUV.

Suspect #1 is described as male, 5'5" tall, thin build, with an accent. He was wearing a black toque, black face mask, black hooded winter jacket, grey pants and was carrying a black bag.

Suspect #2 is described as male, 6' tall, thin build. He was wearing a black winter hat with beige fur lining, black face mask, a black jacket with beige on the inside and dark pants.
