SUSPECT ARRESTED AFTER CARJACKING IN OSHAWA

A 21-year-old male was arrested for a carjacking incident and a fail to remain in Oshawa on Tuesday afternoon.

On Tuesday, November 2, 2021, at approximately 12:05 p.m. members of Central East Division were dispatched to the area of Simcoe Street South and Olive Avenue for a carjacking. The female victim was attempting to get into her vehicle when she was assaulted and the suspect fled in her white Ford Escape. The suspect was involved in a minor collision on Montrave Street and fled from the scene. The stolen vehicle, which incurred front end damage and was leaking fluids was located in a parking lot on King Street West. Police arrested the suspect nearby.

Nelson KINGSTON, age 21, of No Fixed Address is charged with: Robbery; Posses Property Obtained by Crime over \$5,000; Dangerous Operation of a Conveyance; Fail to Remain; Leave Accident Scene - Fail to Give Name/Offer Assistance; Fail to Comply and Drive Motor Vehicle - No Licence.

OFFICER CHARGED WITH DANGEROUS OPERATION AND POINTING A FIREARM

A Durham Regional Police Service officer has been charged after an altercation during a traffic stop in North

Durham.

Members of the DRPS Professional Standards Unit began an investigation after they became aware of an incident involving the officer. The officer was suspended during the investigation and on Monday, November 1, 2021, the officer was arrested and is now facing charges.

Investigators are looking to speak with any witnesses that may have seen the interaction during this traffic stop that occurred on July 17, 2021, at approximately 10:30 p.m., near Highway 48 west of Highway 12 in Beaverton.

Matthew LOWE, age 24, of Toronto, has been charged with: Dangerous Operation of a Conveyance and Pointing a Firearm.

LANCET NEEDLE FOUND IN HALLOWEEN CANDY IN WHITBY

Police are investigating an incident in which a yellow lancet needle was located loosely in a bag of Halloween candy in Whitby.

On Sunday, October 31, 2021, at approximately 9:35 p.m., members of Central West Division responded to a call near Dunlop Street and Henry Street in Whitby for a suspicious item found in a Halloween candy bag. As the complainant was going through her Halloween candy, they located a yellow blood sugar lancet needle inside the bag. Police have not received any other complaints, however DRPS are asking that par-

ents to thoroughly check their kids candy before consuming.

MALE CHARGED IN FAIL TO REMAIN IN COURTICE

An 18-year-old Courtice teen was arrested after an altercation involving a knife and a fail to remain collision in a parking lot on Nash Road in Courtice, Monday afternoon.

On Monday, November 1, 2021, at approximately 2:24 p.m., members of East Division were called to a fail to remain collision at the Courtice High School parking lot on Nash Road. Police arrived to find a female victim with minor injuries. Further investigation revealed that there was an altercation between the suspect and another male in which a knife was produced by the suspect. The suspect pushed a female at the scene and then sped off in a black Honda. The vehicle fled the scene striking a school bus and then a female student prior to leaving. Police identified the driver and he is now facing charges.

SUSPECTS WANTED AFTER BREAK AND ENTER INVESTIGATION IN PICKERING.

Three armed suspects are wanted in a break and enter that occurred last Monday in

Pickering.

On Monday, October 25, 2021, at approximately 4:05 p.m., members of West Division were called to a home on Glenanna Road for a break and enter call. The female victim arrived home to find her rear door smashed. She confronted one male who was in the home. This suspect pulled out a handgun and threatened her. The suspect fled the home and the victim gave chase. The suspect jumped into a white SUV, occupied by two other males. The suspects stole personal items and a safe from within the home.

Police are looking for witnesses, specifically a Lyft driver who was on the scene at the time of the incident.

The suspect in the home is described as male, Black, 6'3" tall, he was wearing a black puffy jacket, black ski mask, black pants and black shoes. The other two suspects are described as male, Black. The vehicle is described as a white SUV with tinted windows.

SUSPICIOUS DEATH IN OSHAWA

Durham Regional Police Service officers are investigating a suspicious death at a residence in Oshawa.

On Tuesday, November 2, 2021, at approximately 3:30 p.m., members of Central East Division were called to a residence on Phillip Murray Avenue in Oshawa. A young child returned home to find his grandmother; a 67-year-old female deceased in the residence. Emergency Services and police arrived and the female was pronounced deceased.

The Coroner attended the scene and a post mortem will be scheduled. The death has

been deemed suspicious at this time. The investigation continues.

A 52-year-old female is facing 44 charges related to 40 incidents of storage locker break and enters.

From July to October 2021, the accused broke into storage facilities in Ajax and Whitby and stole various per-

sonal items. Investigators from the West and Central West Divisions Criminal Investigations Branch, Property Crime Units worked diligently to solve 40 incidents with this arrest.

OPERATOR OF SUPPORT CLINIC IN BOWMANVILLE CHARGED WITH ASSAULT

A 29-year-old female has been charged with assaulting a child at a Bowmanville learning centre for Autistic children.

On Wednesday, October 27, 2021, investigators from the Major Crime - Special Victim's Unit arrested the owner/Clinical Director of Think Tank Therapy in Bowmanville with assault. It is alleged that on two separate occasions, the suspect physically assaulted a non-verbal eight-year-old child. It is believed that the assaults occurred early October of 2021. Investigators are working with Durham Children's Aid Society and the family of the victim.

Michelle GALLAGHER, age 29, of Clarington is charged with Assault x2.

TWO SUSPECTS ARRESTED AND SEIZED A LOADED FIREARM AND DRUGS

Officers have arrested two suspects after seizing a loaded firearm and drugs following an investigation in Whitby.

On Wednesday, October 27, 2021, members of the DRPS Gun and Gang Unit concluded a firearm and drug trafficking investigation. On this date, investigators made two arrests and executed search warrants at two residences, one in Whitby and the other in Toronto.

As a result of the investigation, police seized fentanyl, cocaine, Canadian currency and a loaded handgun. Street value of seized drugs and cash is approximately \$24,000

Kacy HIBBERT, age 44, of Invergordon Avenue in Toronto, has been charged with: Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking x 2 (cocaine, fentanyl), Possession Contrary to Order; Possession of a Loaded Restricted/Prohibited Firearm; Possess Loaded Restricted/Prohibited Firearm Not Holding Licence and Unlicensed Person Possess Prohibited/Restricted Weapon.

Melissa HERN, age 51, of Main Street in Clarington, has been charged with Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking (cocaine).
