BLOC QUÉBÉCOIS LEADER TESTS POSITIVE FOR CORONAVIRUS

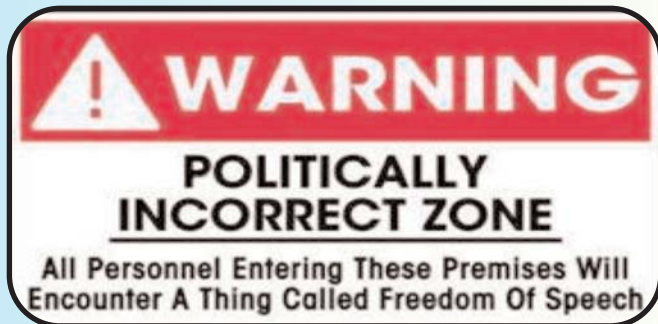
Yves-François Blanchet, the leader of the Bloc Québécois, has been diagnosed with the novel coronavirus.

Canadian Vigilance Test

Rapidly increasing communications, sophisticated social platforms, high speed internet development and dark web activities, reaching far beyond traditional methods of intelligence operations are now being employed by Canada's state adversaries. In pursuit of their unique national objectives, these methods are employed to conduct espionage and foreign influence activities against Canadians and Canadian interests.

These actions are especially directed at intellectual property, high technology and various fields of research and development. Canadian Universities are obviously a fertile ground of operations for foreign entities interested in snitching sensitive Canadian technology.

Unfortunately, Canadian politicians and the public seem unaware of these threats, treating them superficially, which will result in grave consequences to the Canadian economy and our people's wellbeing.

Many years ago, as a recent emigrant from communist Romania, I was looked upon with suspicion, thanks to the cold war situation that existed at the time. There were well defined enemies and Canada was, justly taking protective measures against perceived enemies. As an individual these suspicions hurt me, preventing me from fully capitalizing on my engineering education, as I needed to find employment to put bread on the table for my young family. Years passed, the Berlin wall fell, and the subsequent collapse of the Soviet Union brought forward a new world reality, which made the identification of threats more difficult.

However, the Canadian intelligence agencies and general public still live in the cold war mentality. They continue to perceive Russia as the main threat, showing a general lack of confidence in former East European Countries, which are now on the speedy road to implementing democracy and the rule of law. For example, Romania, which joined NATO in 2004 and participated in the actions in Afghanistan, was still considered a scheduled country by our military chiefs when I was deployed as a Canadian military engineer in Kandahar in 2007.

Despite all the rapid and dramatic changes in the world, especially in Europe, Canada still maintains the old mentality of the cold war. Russia is still perceived as the main threat. It is a threat, but not the main one. The main threat today, let's face it, is China.

There was a time when China seemed to be the country most worshiped by the main parties in Canada, despite the fact that it is a thoroughly communist country. Even today, the Liberals and the Prime Minister are quite silent on China despite crushing evidence of industrial exploitation and intellectual thievery, not to mention the Conservatives, with new leader Erin O'Toole, paying more noisy lip service as the wind blows, without taking any action.

Canada seemed to be obsessed with China, grossly misled by the appearance of false and fake democratic reforms. Canadian politicians of all stripes, including Prime Ministers, rushed to visit China, praising its achievements, signing economic agreements worth billions of dollars, hoping to do trade with the emerging new China, together with greedy businessman in pursuit of easy profits.

Without doubt, China has done well for itself and congratulations are in order. They have used a perfect plan of deception, which has worked extremely well. Today they are an undisputed world power which can no longer be sidelined.

The ignorance of politicians in Canada and the western world is now bearing fruit. Today, China holds two wrongfully imprisoned Canadians, mislead in the Covid -19 pandemic, precipitated the Hong Kong crisis and the military buildup in south East Asia. These controversies illustrate the true face of a carefully engineered, ingenious, capitalistic communist regime built on the complacency of western democracies..

How was this possible you ask? Well, the Western world, including Canada, opened its doors wide to China in various fields of trade, economic and scientific cooperation. China clearly took advantage of this well intentioned opportunity fully and cleverly exploiting it. The end result, at least in Canada, is a severely crippled manufacturing sector. Our strategic supply of protective equipment and supplies (or lack thereof) during the pandemic is a clear example.

Then there is Chinese investment in our mining, natural resources industries and sensitive high technology mining equipment industry, such as the Nexen case; and various IT equipments. All these take-overs happened under the approving eyes of politicians and senior public service managers. I personally tried to raise an alarm when in parliament, but in vain. I was a lone pariah and totally ignored.

I would like to take a special look at research and development where Canadian Universities have very close contacts with Chinese entities, sometimes with shadowy affiliation.

Three Canadian universities are conducting a lot of shared research with Chinese academics: the University of Toronto (my alma matter in engineering physics), McGill University and the University of Waterloo. These are among the top ten universities in the world partnering with Chinese military institutions.

While there may be nothing wrong academically with doing shared research, it is ethically important to know who benefits from it, and for what purpose.

Some of the latest discoveries in the world today, illustrate the malevolent influence of Chinese communist state engineered actions aimed at acquiring sensitive Western technologies and intellectual properties. They are essentially meant to bolster the modernization and capability of China's military.

Just last week, the U.S. State Department revealed that over the past three months, it has expelled more than a thousand Chinese "high-risk graduate students and research scholars" who were working at American universities.

The US is not alone in suggesting that the Chinese military has encouraged or even enlisted academics to collaborate with counterparts in the West, in person or remotely, while masking their affiliations with the military or its institutes of learning.

In Australia, it has been documented, that there were a startling array of projects which saw Australian scientists collaborate with Chinese universities to carry out research beneficial to the Chinese military, some of it funded by Australian taxpayers. Much of that research found its way into new Chinese weapons systems or the surveillance networks employed by the Chinese regime.

In Canada, the Commons Committee on Canada-China Relations heard similar allegations in testimony in the weeks leading up to prorogation, including the claim that some of the core technology behind China's surveillance network was developed in Canadian universities.

There were just over 140,000 Chinese nationals studying in Canada before the pandemic hit. China is now interested in Artificial Intelligence and robotics, which have important applications in the Chinese military.

They're looking for help from Canada in artificial intelligence, biotechnology, advanced materials, quantum computing; all areas that can help their military as well as other aspects of their economy. If we're partnering with China in these areas, our R&D, our government funded R&D, could be directly benefiting the Chinese military.

Richard Fadden, who headed CSIS from 2009 to 2013, was the first director to go public with concerns about influence campaigns by the Chinese Communist Party here.

Fadden has viewed China as being the most active and aggressive state player in the acquisition of other countries' intellectual property and technical secrets.

"We don't worry as much about national security as does the United States. So I think, from that perspective, we're viewed as an easier target."

So isn't it time to wake up Canada?!

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
