Starting Monday, May 6, the municipality said it will begin work to improve the roads and infrastructure on Brown Street, Albert Street, and Victoria Street, just off Liberty

Street in Bowmanville. The work is expected to be

completed by September 2024, and includes: Local storm sewer installation.Local watermain replacement, including water services Removal of existing road asphalt and road base Subdrain installation.

Curb and gutter installation Driveway apron reinstatement Concrete sidewalk improvements

Landscape restoration and tree protection/planting

The following roads will be closed to through traffic for the duration of the work:

Brown Street, from Queen Street to Victoria Street Victoria Street, from Liberty

Street to Ontario Street Albert Street, from Liberty

Street to Brown Street Access to properties for both vehicular and pedestrian traffic will be maintained for residents, except for very short periods. During construction, a temporary water supply system will be in place for affected homes. Crews will ensure

waste collection and mail delivery services are uninterrupted.

New all-way stops

The municipality is implementing new all-way stops at several intersections between mid-April and June.

The following intersections are transitioning to all-way stops: Aspen Springs Drive at West Side Drive

Bons Avenue at Gimblett Drive and Honeyman Drive Mearns Avenue at Longworth Avenue

Boulevard Rhonda Lawrence Gate

Sandringham Strathallan Drive Sandringham Drive at Glenabbey Drive Trulls Road at George

Reynolds Drive

Advisory signs are in place to let drivers know of the upcoming change. The new stop signs have been installed but will remain covered until the pavement markings have been added, the municipality said.
