Oshawa council green lights private cannabis shops

During Thursday night's meeting at city hall, Oshawa council voted to allow private cannabis retail stores to run in the city.

During Thursday night's meeting at city hall, Oshawa council voted to allow private cannabis retail stores to run in the city.

Oshawa council has high expectations for how local cannabis stores could benefit the city after it voted to host

pot shops.

At a special meeting at city hall Thursday night, council voted 7-4 in favour of allowing private retail cannabis stores in Oshawa, Ont., instead of the other option on the table — opting out, or prohibiting, this type of business in the city.

Durham-based cannabis consultant Marko Ivancicevic is crossing his fingers that he'll be able to open his own cannabis shop in Oshawa. He says he has submitted his expression of interest to the

Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario, which regulates Ontario's retail cannabis outlets and will be randomly picking the winning applicants Friday.

"[I'm] very excited," said Ivancicevic. "To finally have the ability to potentially open a store in what I see as my home is a great feeling to have."

Global News reached out to Oshawa's mayor, Dan Carter, on the council decision, but he was unavailable for an interview.

In deciding which option to choose, council considered the results of a recent city survey, in which 62 per cent of people said 'yes' to hosting cannabis stores in the city. Many said the benefits include economic opportunities and job creation, according to a public report.

The nearly 40 per cent of people who shot down the idea of having private cannabis stores in Oshawa cited reasons such as increased access to cannabis by youth and negative impacts on the city's reputation.

GM REAFFIRMS OSHAWA CLOSURE AFTER MEETINGS WITH ONTARIO AND FEDERAL OFFICIALS

The automaker will go ahead with its plans to wind down its Oshawa operations by the end of 2019 at a loss of about 2,600 unionized workers and 340 other staff.

Ontario and federal politicians have walked away emptyhanded from meetings with General Motors about the company's plans to close the Oshawa Assembly Plant.

Economic Federal Development Minister Navdeep Bains met briefly with GM CEO Mary Barra on the sidelines of an auto show in Detroit Monday and Ontario Premier Doug Ford met with GM president Mark Reuss Tuesday morning.

Both politicians said they urged the company to reconsider its decision to close the plant and are disappointed that GM did not budge on the closure.

"Following a meeting with Unifor, I promised to press

General Motors executives to extend operations at the Oshawa plant in order to give the affected workers more time to deal with the impacts of the closure," said Ford in a statement after the GM meet-

"Despite raising this on repeated instances, I was disappointed to hear that General Motors' position has not changed."

Unifor president Jerry Dias has been critical of Ford's failure to fight for Oshawa workers after the premier said after the announcement that little could be done to alter the minds of GM executives. Ford met with Dias Monday and committed to raising the issue with the company.

Bains said in a statement Monday night that he urged the company to reconsider the Oshawa closure and is ready to play an active role in finding solutions for the workers.

"GM is making a mistake by giving up on Oshawa's workers," he said in a statement.

The company said in a statement that it told government officials it intends to continue to be a major manufacturer in Canada with its Ingersoll and St. Catharines plants and an expanded automotive research base.

Unifor has fought unsuccessfully to have the Ingersoll plant designated as the lead producer of the Chevrolet Equinox, which would create production certainty for the line. The Equinox is also produced at two plants in Mexico and the union is concerned the company could shift more production to the country.

GM announced in late November that it would wind down its Oshawa operations by the end of 2019 at a loss of about 2,600 unionized workers and 340 other staff.

"In the Zone" Traffic Blitz Results in Over 1,200 Tickets

A one-week traffic safety blitz around neighbourhood schools in Durham Region has resulted in more than 1,200 traffic tickets being issued.

The Durham Regional Police Traffic Services Branch, in conjunction with officers from all divisions, initiated a zero-tolerance traffic enforcement campaign targeting school and community safety zones during the week of January 7-11, 2019.

During this week, officers issued 1,299 tickets for various driving offences in and around schools, which included 872 tickets for speeding. Other tickets included 25 for stop sign and red light violations and 10 tickets issued for distracted driving.

The goal of the annual "In the Zone" enforcement campaign is to ensure high officer visibility and proactive enforcement in and around school zones during the first week back to school.

CANADA'S CONSERVATIVES CALL FOR EMERGENCY FOREIGN AFFAIRS **COMMITTEE MEETING ON**

CHINESE - CANADIAN RELATIONS

The Hon. Erin O'Toole, Conservative Shadow Minister for Foreign Affairs, issued the following statement after requesting an emergency meeting of the Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs and International Development to discuss the state of Chinese-Canadian relations:

"Since the December 1st arrest of Huawei executive Meng Wanzhou, Canadians have been subject to retaliatory detentions by the Chinese government, while dozens of others have been detained on administrative grounds or had their visas questioned.

"Prime Minister Trudeau confirmed that he believes that

these detentions are 'completely politically motivated' but he has still not called the Chinese President about these actions. Clearly, Justin Trudeau's naïve approach to diplomacy is not working.

"That is why Conservatives on the Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs are calling for an emergency committee meeting. The Liberals need to outline what steps they are taking to ensure the immediate release of detained Canadians and be clear whether or not it is safe for Canadians to travel to China. The Canadian Ambassador to China, the Hon. John McCallum is in Canada to brief the liberal government

on the situation and the committee should have the opportunity to hear from him as well.

Canadians are rightly concerned about family members in China and are question whether it is safe to travel there amid the present dispute.

"Canada's Conservatives will continue to urge Justin Trudeau to intervene on behalf of Canadians detained in China and to provide certainty to the hundreds of Canadians with family members working in China or those considering travel to the country."



Ontario Cancels Scheduled 2019 Licence Fee Increase

Ontario's Government for the People is making life more affordable by putting a stop to hunting licence fee increases for all Ontario residents and removing the \$2 service fee. Canadian Housing Starts Trend Decreases in December

The trend in housing starts was 206,981 units in December 2018, compared to 212,338 units in November 2018, according to Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC). This trend measure is a sixmonth moving average of the monthly seasonally adjusted annual rates (SAAR) of housing

"The national trend in housing starts decreased in December the fifth decline in the last six months," said Bob Dugan, chief economist. CMHC's "Reflecting these declines, total annual housing starts in 2018 were lower than in 2017. as lower single-detached starts more than offset a slight increase in multi-family starts this year. Nonetheless, total housing starts remain elevated when compared to historical averages.

Monthly Highlights Vancouver

Housing starts in the Vancouver Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) continued trending lower in December 2018, ending the year with an 11% decrease compared to 2017 despite that rental units rose by 40% in response to a tight rental market. City of Vancouver's rental and condo sectors are the top two drivers to the annual housing starts. Surrey led the overall decline with housing starts down by 27% in 2018

Victoria

Total year-to-date housing starts initiated in Metro Victoria reached a level not seen since 1976 in December. Rental units were half of all housing starts in 2018 in response to heightened rental demand and low vacancy rates.

Regina

December total housing starts trended lower due to a decline in multi-family construction. In 2018, housing starts in the Regina CMA declined by 41% to 1,139 units from 1,923 in 2017. Single-detached starts declined by 47%, while multi-family starts were lower by 37%, compared to the previous year. A weak labour market, tighter credit market conditions, rising construction costs and elevated resale supply - all combined to reduce demand for newly constructed homes.

Kingston

Kingston recorded the highest number of starts in any given month since September 2013.

Rental apartments accounted for 77% of total starts in December. These new rental units will contribute needed supply to the market, as the apartment vacancy rate in Kingston has been trending lower since 2016. The total number of housing starts in 2018 was significantly above the 5-year average, with gains for all dwelling types.

Toronto In 2018, the Toronto CMA saw the most apartment starts ever recorded and overall housing starts were up 6% from a year ago. High prices, borrowing costs, and a widening price gap with resale market alternatives weighed down significantly on single-detached starts, which were the lowest in almost four decades. The deteriorating affordability for low-rise homes has fueled the demand for relatively affordable higher-density housing.

Hamilton

Annual housing starts in Hamilton CMA were the highest since 2004, despite the trend measure moving down in December. Apartment starts were primarily responsible for the high number of overall housing starts in 2018, having reached their highest level in over 40 years. In 2018, more buyers gravitated to less expensive homes and competition for vacant rental units intensified, both of which led to greater demand for new apartments. The appetite for new apartments widespread Hamilton CMA in 2018, occurring in each of three major markets, Burlington, Hamilton and Grimsby

Brantford

A high number of housing starts for December helped annual starts to surpass the 700 mark for just the second time in the past ten years. The price point of new low-rise homes in Brantford attracted more growing families and empty nesters from nearby Hamilton and West GTA markets compared to most years. Singledetached starts rebounded from a slow 2017, while row starts continued to trend up to their highest level since CMHC began tracking starts activity in Brantford over 40 years ago. Montréal

Housing starts in the Montréal area increased slightly in 2018 compared to 2017 (+1%). The decline recorded in the construction of condos (-6%) during this period was more than offset by rental apartment starts (+8%) which hit a 30-year record high. Just under half of all housing starts in the Montreal CMA in 2018 were intended for the rental market, including starts of rental retirement homes. However, most rental starts were intended for the larger nonretirement home sector. Relatively low vacancy rates, the aging population, and stronger demand from young households were likely all factors that stimulated residential construction in the rental market segment.

Province of Québec

The total number of housing starts in Quebec's urban areas in 2018 was practically the same as in 2017. Residential construction in the past year continued to be supported by multi-unit housing starts, a large part of which were rental housing units. This was the case notably in Montréal and Québec. Overall, the growth in the supply of apartments in the province was stimulated by the aging of the population and by immigration.

Halifax

Total housing starts in Halifax picked up pace in December due to a rise in apartment construction. By year-end 2018, multiples starts were up 6% compared to 2017 figures, driven by strong rental demand and migration. Apartment construction in 2018 was predominantly located in the suburban markets of Hammonds Plains and Mainland North, as well as on the Halifax Peninsula.

Prince Edward Island (PEI)

Total housing starts in PEI were 156% higher in December compared to a year ago. Singles were up by 9% and multiples by 347%, which contributed directly

to the considerable monthly increase. This was driven by new multi-unit apartment and seniors' condo projects, in reaction to a near zero vacancy rate on the Island. For 2018, total starts were up 26%, driven primarily by strong job growth and positive international immigration throughout the year.

CMHC uses the trend measure as a complement to the monthly SAAR of housing starts to account for considerable swings in monthly estimates and obtain a more complete picture of Canada's housing market. In some situations analyzing only SAAR data can be misleading. as they are largely driven by the multi-unit segment of the market which can vary significantly from one month to the next.

The standalone monthly SAAR of housing starts for all areas in Canada was 213,419 units in December, down from 224,349 units in November. The SAAR of urban starts decreased by 5.8% in December to 194,594 units. Multiple urban starts decreased by 6.8% to 144,728 units in December while singledetached urban starts decreased by 2.6% to 49,866 units.

Rural starts were estimated at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 18,825 units.

Preliminary Housing Starts data are also available in English and French through our website and through CMHC's Housing Market Information Portal. Our analysts are also available to provide further insight into their respective markets.

U.S., CHINA END TALKS ON TARIFF BATTLE WITH NO WORD ON OUTCOME

The U.S. wants China to Vishnu Varathan in a report. change plans for governmentled creation of Chinese leaders in robotics and other advanced technologies. No changes were announced.

Three days of U.S.-Chinese talks aimed at ending a costly tariff battle wrapped up Wednesday in an optimistic atmosphere after President Donald Trump said they were "going very well!"

No details were immediately announced, but Asian stock markets rose after talks planned for two days were extended to three. Hong Kong's main market index closed up 2.1 per cent and Tokyo rose 1.1 per cent.

A Chinese foreign ministry spokesman, Lu Kang, announced the talks had ended. Lu said he had no details and an official statement would be issued later.

The talks that started Monday were the first face-to-face meeting since Trump and his Chinese counterpart, Xi Jinping, agreed Dec. 1 to suspend further punitive action against each other's imports for 90 days while they negotiate over the fight sparked by American complaints Beijing steals or pressures companies to hand over technology.

"Talks with China are going very well!" Trump said late Tuesday on Twitter.

Washington is pressing Beijing for changes including rolling back plans for government-led creation of Chinese global champions in robotics and other fields. Europe, Japan and other trading partners echo U.S. complaints those violate Beijing's marketopening obligations.

Chinese officials have suggested Beijing might alter its industrial plans but reject pressure to abandon what they consider a path to prosperity and global influence.

Neither side has given any indication its basic position has changed. Economists say the 90-day window is too short to resolve all the conflicts between the biggest and second-biggest economies.

"Even if a deal is cobbled together, the more strident trade hawks in the White House and Trump may not sign off," said Mizuho Bank's Companies that have been

Beijing has tried to defuse pressure for more sweeping change by offering concessions including purchasing more American soybeans, natural gas and other exports. That might offer relief to rural areas that supported Trump in the 2016 election and were targeted by Chinese tariffs.

However, the official Trump put in charge of the talks, U.S. Trade Representative Robert Lighthizer, has focused on pressing Beijing to scrap or change rules Washington says block market access or improperly help Chinese com-

Those include initiatives such as "Made in China 2025," which calls for state-led creation of Chinese global champions in robotics, artificial intelligence and other fields. Washington, Europe, Japan and other trading partners say those violate Beijing's marketopening obligations. American leaders also worry they might erode U.S. industrial leadership.

U.S. companies also want action on Chinese policies they complain improperly favour local companies. Those include subsidies and other favours for high-tech and state-owned industry, rules on technology licensing and preferential treatment of domestic suppliers in government procurement.

The U.S. demands strike at the heart of a state-led development model the ruling Communist Party sees as a great success over the past three decades and is reluctant to give up.

"These issues are much more difficult to solve immediately but are, frankly, much more compelling to U.S. companies," said Jake Parker, vicepresident for China operations of the U.S.-China Business Council, which represents American companies that do business with China.

Beijing also faces pressure over technology from the European Union. The 28nation trade bloc filed its own challenge in the World Trade Organization in June against Chinese licensing rules it said hamper the ability of foreign companies to protect and profit from their technology.

disappointed by Beijing's failure or delays in carrying out commitments want enforcement mechanism with "some kind of penalty for not doing what they promised," said Parker.

"That's not something that's going to be done by March," said Parker. "It's probably going to take a little longer."

For its part, Beijing is unhappy with U.S. export and investment curbs, suggesting it might demand concessions.

Chinese officials complain about controls on "dual use" technology with possible military applications. They say China's companies are treated unfairly in national security reviews of proposed corporate acquisitions, though almost all deals are approved unchanged.

This week's talks went ahead despite tension over the arrest of a Chinese tech executive in Canada on U.S. charges related to possible violations of trade sanctions against Iran.

The American delegation was led by one of Lighthizer's deputies, Jeffrey D. Gerrish. It included agriculture, energy, commerce, treasury and State Department officials.

Trump imposed tariff increases of up to 25 per cent on US\$250 billion of Chinese imports. China responded by imposing penalties on \$110 billion of American goods, slowing customs clearance for U.S. companies and suspending issuing licenses in finance and other businesses.

Chinese exports to the United States held up despite the tariff hikes, but that was due partly to exporters rushing to fill orders before any more increases hit. Forecasters expect American orders to slump this year.

Cooling economic growth in both countries is increasing pressure to reach a settle-

Car and property sales have slumped as Chinese growth fell to a post-global crisis low of 6.5 per cent in the quarter ending in September.

The U.S. economy grew at an annual rate of 3.4 per cent in the third quarter but surveys show consumer confidence weakening.

Corsi v. Mueller advances in court

Dr. Jerome Corsi, my friend of 25 years and my client, is an American hero. Rather than accepting a fraudulent plea deal from Special Counsel Robert Mueller, where he was offered no prison time if he pleaded to one felony count of perjury he did not commit, but only if he would implicate President Donald Trump in so-called Russian collusion, he told Mueller and his leftist pro-Clinton and Obama Democratic prosecutors to stick it where the sun don't shine. Jerry simply could not find it in his Christian heart to lie before the Creator and his Son; nor could he agree to be branded falsely as a felon, losing his right to vote. To the contrary, he has made it clear he would risk being imprisoned by a runaway Deep State prosecutor for the remainder of his life, rather than to lie under oath and implicate the president in alleged wrongdoing.

But Jerry did not stop there! Realizing that he was in a unique position to finally take on Mueller and his fellow hack prosecutors, he did something the president himself should have done long ago, but for the bad advice he has gotten for the better part of the last two years by his television-centric lawyers. Dr. Corsi pushed back and decided to take Mueller on legally and frontal-

Over the last month leading up to today, Jerry authorized my co-counsel David Gray and me to file criminal complaints against Mueller and his leftist prosecutors before Acting Attorney General Matthew Whitaker, the head of the Criminal Division, the U.S. attorney for the District of Columbia, the Office of Professional Responsibility, and the inspector general of the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) to address and remedy this gross prosecutorial misconduct. For good measure, he also authorized David and me to file bar complaints with the Office of Disciplinary Counsel (ODC) of the District of Columbia Bar.

While it is doubtful that ODC will take any action against Mueller, the complaint was filed on principle. The District of Columbia Bar, run by leftists who have donated heavily to the Clintons, Barack Obama and a myriad of Democrats, are generally not interested in enforcing its Rules of Professional Responsibility against their own ilk like Mueller and his comrades. On the other hand, they "specialize" in going after conservatives, like counselor to the president and attorney Kellyanne Conway who is under scrutiny for simple statements, allegedly false, she made on Fox News. Meanwhile, Democratic partisans like Clinton lawyer David Kendall and Michael Cohen's attorney Lanny Davis get a green light to behave unethically.

But the complaints before DOJ are likely to bear fruit, that is, if the president himself finally takes charge and orders investigations. If not, we are prepared to go to court to obtain an order compelling investigations by DOJ, which if done honestly should, in principle, lead to the "prosecution of the prosecutors" on the Mueller team.

In addition, Jerry also instructed me to file a lawsuit before the federal court in Washington, D.C., over the illegal and unconstitutional surveillance of him and his family without probable cause that he had committed a crime, orchestrated by Mueller and his lackeys in the Deep State Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), the National Security Agency (NSA) and the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA). For added measure, the complaint, which we filed before Christmas, also sued for the criminal grand jury leaks that have been coming from the special counsel intended to smear Jerry and his family – to try to bludgeon him to capitulate.

Since a judge I had successfully appeared before, the Honorable Richard J. Leon, had previously ruled in my favor that this type of illegal surveillance was unconstitutional - "almost Orwellian" he called it - I asked that this new Corsi lawsuit be assigned to him. This jurist, given the expertise on the issues he had acquired, it was thought, was best suited to hear the case. And, incidentally he was not a Clinton or Obama appointee, nearly all of whom in this federal court are extremely biased and partisan and most assuredly would approve of Mueller's tactics so long as it was to further the removal of Trump as our 45th president.

The one wild card in designating the complaint as related and thus preliminarily assigned to Judge Leon was that I had learned that the judge himself was illegally surveilled by the Deep State. I had asked him in the prior lawsuits (which he later dismissed for no good reason and now are on appeal), if he had been coerced by the Deep State to get rid of them.

Immediately after I filed the Corsi complaint, Judge Leon set the matter down for a hearing, which DOJ lawyers later tried to postpone on the phony excuse that its legal counsel could not work given the partial government shutdown. On behalf of Dr. Corsi, I opposed this, and Judge Leon agreed. And an initial hearing on the issue of the related case assignment thus went forward Thursday. 

STUDY VERIFIES ECONOMIC SHOCK OF POTENTIAL

GENERAL MOTORS OSHAWA CLOSURE

A new independent study verifies a closure of the General (GM) Oshawa Motors Assembly Plant would create an economic shock, resulting in 24,000 lost jobs and a loss of \$1 billion per year in government revenue.

"We're looking at tens of thousands of jobs and a direct hit to the GDP," said Unifor National President Jerry Dias. "Should GM proceed with plans to close Oshawa, the economic impact would be

and long term."

Unifor commissioned the independent study, conducted by Robin Somerville, Director of the Centre for Spatial Economics and President of Quantitative Economic Decisions Inc., to examine the economic impact of a potential closure of GM's Oshawa operations at the end of 2019. The study shows there would be an immediate fallout in 2020, with Ontario's GDP expected to fall by \$5 billion substantial, both in the short and a decline in Ontario gov-

ernment revenues of \$330 million. In the long-term, Ontario's economy would shrink by an average of \$4 billion each year to 2030, leading to a reduction in Ontario government revenues of nearly a half billion and federal government revenues of just over half a billion a year. The study also projects job losses will mount over time to reach 14.000 in Ontario and a further 10,000 elsewhere across Canada by 2025. "There would be a major ripple effect that would be felt far beyond Oshawa and even Ontario," said Dias. "We're asking Canadians and governments at all levels to make it clear to GM that we will hold them accountable should they decide to inflict this damage by closing a top-quality and productive plant for no other reason than corporate greed." The report comes days before GM's January 11, 2019

investor event where the company is expected to outline its future corporate direction, which includes expansion of production in Mexico. Timed to coincide with the investor event, hundreds of Ontario workers will rally in Windsor, Ontario directly across from GM's Detroit headquarters to call on the automaker to continue operating its Oshawa Assembly Plant and maintain production in Canada. SECTOR JOBS AND INVESTMENT ONTARIO ADVOCATES FOR AUTO

In their meetings with representatives from Ford, Magna, GM, Chrysler, Honda and Toyota, they discussed the measures that the Ontario government has already taken to make Ontario open for business. They also heard from industry leaders on how the government can support auto manufacturing jobs in Ontario.

"We are committed to supporting Ontario's auto manufacturing sector and manufacturing workers," said Ford. "We continue to listen to workers and employers about how best to support the creation of good new jobs and help people find those jobs."

"Ontario's auto sector supports hundreds of thousands of families across the province," said Smith. "Our government is creating an environment where job creators? including those in the

auto sector? can continue to grow and thrive. Our message to industry leaders is clear: Ontario is open for business." The government is taking concrete measures to make Ontario open for business including cutting red tape, cancelling the cap-and-trade carbon tax and reducing electricity costs.
