## YOUTH CHARGED WITH THREATENING ANOTHER MALE WITH A KNIFE

A male is facing charges after threatening to stab another male at the Oshawa GO station.

On Thursday, November 21, 2024, at approximately 8:00 p.m., officers from Central West Division responded to a report of an armed person at the Oshawa GO station parking lot, located at 915 Bloor Street West. According to the information received, a male suspect had threatened to stab another male following a dispute over the way the victim looked at the suspect. Officers quickly located the suspect and a knife at the scene. The individual was taken into custody without incident.

A 15-year-old male from Oshawa has been charged with Uttering Threats.

## MALE RECOVERING AFTER BEING SHOT IN CAESAREA

A male is facing charges in relation to a shooting in Caesarea on July 6, 2024, that left a male with life-altering injuries.

On November 21, 2024, members of the North Division Criminal Investigations Branch, with the assistance of the Tactical Support Unit (TSU) and K9 Unit, executed a searched warrant at a residence in the area of Albion Road and Martin Grove Road, in Toronto. A male was located in the residence and taken into custody without incident. Two additional suspects, who are currently in custody at a Toronto detention centre, have also been identified.

**Kwabena DUODU**, age 21 from Toronto is charged with: Aggravated Assault, Forcible Confinement, Point Firearm, Possess Restricted/Prohibited Firearm – No Licence, Utter Threats, Occupy Motor Vehicle with Firearm, and Careless Use/Handle/Store of Firearm.

## SUSPECT WANTED AFTER SHOOTING IN OSHAWA

Police are searching for a male suspect after two vehi-

cles were involved in a shooting in Oshawa.

On Wednesday, November 20, 2024, at approximately 12:40 p.m., members of Central East Division responded to a report of gun shots in the area of Elmgrove Avenue and Westmount Street. Officers searched the area and located a bullet hole in the front of a residence. Further investigation revealed that at approximately 12:35 p.m., the driver of a black Audi A3 two-door, and the driver of a silver Infiniti G37 four-door sedan, were involved in an altercation in the south east corner of the Oshawa Centre parking lot. The driver of the Infiniti fired a gun at the Audi, as both vehicles fled the area at a high rate of speed.

**MALE ARRESTED AFTER MAKING THREATS IN WHITBY**  
A male is facing charges after he made numerous threats from his apartment window toward another male in the parking lot in Whitby. On Friday, November 15, 2024, at approximately 7:25 a.m., members of Central West Division responded to an armed person call in the area of Dundas Street West and Palace Street. Initial information was that a male armed with a gun, was making threats from his apartment window toward another male in the parking lot. Officers arrived on scene and contained the area, while negotiations for the suspect to surrender were attempted. After a short time, officers, with the assistance of the Tactical Support Unit (TSU), entered the apartment unit and took the suspect into custody. No firearm was located during a search of the apartment.

**William Joseph BOLTON**, age 33 from Whitby is charged with: Utter Threats, Assault with a Weapon, and Breach Probation.

**FIREARM AND DRUGS FOUND DURING STOLEN VEHICLE INVESTIGATION IN OSHAWA**  
Two males are facing charges after they were found in a

stolen vehicle with a firearm and drugs in Oshawa. On Wednesday, November 13, 2024, at approximately 9:10 p.m., a member of DRPS was on proactive patrol when they observed a suspiciously parked SUV and RV in the area of King Street West and Park Road South. Further checks of the RV registration confirmed it was stolen. During the investigation two males exited the RV and fled from officers on foot. After a short foot pursuit, one suspect was taken into custody without incident. The second suspect was located attempting to hide in the rear of the SUV and was also taken into custody without incident. A search of the vehicles located a rifle, ammunition, and several drugs.

**MALE WITH LIFE-THREATENING INJURIES AFTER SINGLE VEHICLE COLLISION**  
A male has been charged after the completion of a colli-



stolen vehicle with a firearm and drugs in Oshawa.

On Friday, July 19, 2024, at approximately 5:20 p.m., members of North Division responded to the report of a single motor vehicle collision on Uxbridge Concession Road 7, south of Chalk Lake Road, in Uxbridge. A white GMC Sierra, driven by a 47-year-old male, was travelling southbound when it lost control, failed to negotiate the curve, entered the east ditch, and struck some trees. The driver was extracted by Uxbridge Fire Services and airlifted via Air Ornge to a Toronto area trauma centre. On Wednesday, November 20, 2024, members of the Collision Investigation Unit (CIU) concluded their investigation and charged the involved driver.

**Christopher RANSOME**, age 47 from Keswick is charged with: Impaired Operation of a Conveyance, and Impaired Operation of a Conveyance – Exceed.

## FEMALE KILLED IN ASSAULT IN OSHAWA

A female has died after being stabbed by her husband in Oshawa.

On Sunday, November 17, 2024, at approximately 12:30 a.m., members from Central East Division attended a residence on Eulalie Avenue after receiving a 9-1-1 call from the address. Officers arrived on scene and located a female with traumatic injuries. She was rushed to a Toronto-area trauma centre where she was pronounced deceased. A male at the home was taken into custody without incident. The female victim has been identified as 48-year-old Parween ADEL.

**Hakim ADEL**, age 41, of Oshawa has been charged with Second Degree Murder. November is recognized as Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) Awareness Month, a

**SUFFERED SERIOUS INJURIES AFTER BEING STRUCK BY A VEHICLE IN OSHAWA**  
On Tuesday, November 12, 2024, at approximately 4:15 p.m., members of Central East Division responded to a collision in the area of Rossland Road West and Simcoe Street North. A pick-up truck, being driven by a 20-year-old female, was southbound on Simcoe Street North attempting to turn right at Rossland Road West, when it struck a 21-year-old female who was crossing the street. The driver of the pick-up truck stopped and assisted the pedestrian while waiting for police.

The 21-year-old female was transported to a Toronto-area trauma centre in serious but non-life-threatening condition. Members of the DRPS - Collision Investigation Unit (CIU), attended the scene and investigated the circumstances of the incident. The area of the roadway was closed for several hours while evidence was collected. This collision is still under investigation.

**FOUR SUSPECTS WANTED AFTER ATM THEFT IN PICKERING**  
Four suspects are wanted after breaking into a mall and stealing an ATM from a bank in Pickering. On Tuesday, November 12, 2024, at approximately 3:45 a.m., members of West Division responded to an alarm call at the TD Bank inside the Shops at Pickering City Centre, located at 1355 Kingston Road. Four sus-

pects used a stolen construction backhoe loader to gain entry to the mall by smashing the front entrance. Once inside the mall the suspects destroyed one ATM and stole a second. The suspects fled the area in a white Dodge Ram pick-up truck.

**SEEKING SUSPECT AFTER TWO WOMEN ASSAULTED ON GO TRAINS**  
Police are looking to identify a suspect involved in two separate assaults on the GO Train Monday evening.

On Monday, November 11, 2024 at approximately 7:40 p.m., members of West Division responded to Pickering GO Station located at 1322 Bayly Street, in Pickering for an assault. A female was travelling on the 6:50 p.m. eastbound train from Union Station when she was assaulted by the suspect. The suspect struck the victim in the face multiple times and then exited the train. The victim sustained injuries and was transported to a local hospital, where her injuries were assessed and upgraded to serious. Two hours later, at approximately 9:20 p.m., members of West Division responded to a second assault at Pickering GO Station. A female was travelling on the 8:20 p.m. eastbound train from Union Station when she was assaulted by the suspect. The victim was able to get to an adjacent cab where a group of citizens waited with the victim for police at Pickering Station. The victim sustained injuries and was transported to a local hospital. Police believe the same suspect is involved in both incidents and are appealing for the public's assistance in identifying him.
