THE NAVY LEAGUE CADET PROGRAM
The Navy League Cadet program offers young Canadians between 9 and 12 years old the chance to learn new skills, make life-long friends and grow into well-rounded individuals through fun and educational community based activities with a maritime foundation.
The Navy League Cadet program aims to help young Canadians learn life skills including citizenship, teamwork and self-discipline. Our programming is designed to help cadets become more aware of the world around them, become self-sufficient and confident in their own skills. Throughout their training, Navy League Cadets learn what good leadership looks like, how to work together, and how to overcome challenges.

FOUNDATIONAL ELEMENTS OF CADET TRAINING

- SEAMANSHIP**
Providing basic seamanship and nautical skills through hands-on activities and instruction.
- LEADERSHIP**
Upholding honesty, transparency, and ethical behavior in all actions.
- CIVIC RESPONSIBILITY**
Promoting citizenship and community involvement through volunteer work and public service.
- PHYSICAL FITNESS**
Emphasizing the importance of physical activity and healthy living.
- DISCIPLINE**
Instilling discipline, self-control, and respect for authority.

PROGRAM COSTS
The cost of joining the program is minimal. To help make the program accessible to all, cadets and their parents are required to participate in fundraising activities. Cadet uniforms are provided by The Navy League of Canada. Cadets are required to maintain their uniforms and return them when they leave the program.
