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Female Seriously Injured After Single Vehicle Collision in Bowmanville

A 38-year-old female is in critical but stable condition after a single vehicle collision in Bowmanville. On Monday, August 17, 2026, at approximately 7:25 a.m. officers from East Division responded to a single motor vehicle collision in the area of Energy Drive and Holt Road. The 38-year-old female was driving a black 2025 Nissan Sentra westbound on Energy Drive, west of Holt Road, when it left the roadway and struck a hydro pole on the north side. The driver was transported to a Toronto area trauma hospital with serious, non-life threatening injuries.

Pedestrian Dies Following Collision in Ajax

A 28-year-old male has died following a collision involving a pedestrian in Ajax on Tuesday evening. On Tuesday, August 18, 2026, at approximately 8:40 p.m., members of West Division responded to a report of a pedestrian struck near Salem Road and Chambers Drive in Ajax. A 2027 Freightliner, operated by a 60-year-old male, was exiting the westbound Highway 401 off-ramp at Salem Road when it made a right turn and struck a pedestrian on roller blades. The pedestrian was pronounced deceased at the scene. The driver of the Freightliner remained on the scene and was co-operative with police. Collision investigators from the Collision Investigation Unit were called and the roadway was closed for several hours to collect evidence and conduct their investigation. The investigation is ongoing. Police would like to hear from any witnesses to this collision, who have not already spoken to police.

Driver Charged in Single Vehicle Collision That Injured Four in Whitby

The driver responsible for a single vehicle collision in Whitby that injured all occupants of the vehicle in is now facing several charges. On Thursday, May 28, 2026, at approximately 5:30 a.m.,

members of Central West Division responded to a single vehicle collision near Myrtle Road West and Duffs Road. A Toyota RAV4 was travelling eastbound on Myrtle Road when it lost control and went off the roadway, ejecting at least two occupants from the vehicle. An 18-year-old male and a 19-year-old male were transported to a Toronto-area trauma centre with serious injuries. A 16-year-old female was airlifted to a Toronto-area trauma centre with serious injuries. A 14-year-old male suffered minor injuries and was transported to a local-area hospital. Members of the DRPS Collision Investigation Unit attended the scene to conduct an investigation. The roads in the area were closed for several hours while evidence was collected. On Thursday, August 13, 2026, members of the Collision Investigation Unit concluded their investigation and arrested the driver of the Toyota without incident. **Alexander BURGI**, age 18 from Whitby is charged with: Dangerous Operation - Cause Bodily Harm x2, Impaired Operation - Cause Bodily Harm x2, Impaired Operation - Exceed, Take Vehicle Without Consent, Stunt Driving, Novice Driver - Blood Alcohol Above Zero, G1 Licence - Not Accompanied by Qualified Driver. **Male Arrested After Striking Pedestrian with Vehicle in Oshawa** A male is facing several charges after intentionally striking a pedestrian with his vehicle in Oshawa. On Thursday, August 6, 2026, at approximately 10:30 a.m., members of Central East Division responded to a collision involving a pedestrian in the area of Nonquon Road and Mary Street North. A black Volkswagen sedan travelling northbound on Nonquon Road left its lane and accelerated into the oncoming traffic lane, striking a 36-year-old male pedestrian. The Volkswagen fled the area and failed to remain at the scene. Officers and Emergency Medical Services attended the scene and located the victim suffering from critical life-threatening injuries. The victim was transported to a local-

area hospital before being flown via Air Ornge to a Toronto-area trauma centre where he remains in critical condition. Members of the Collision Investigation Unit attended the scene to conduct their investigation and later located the suspect vehicle parked unoccupied a short distance away. On Friday, August 7, 2026, at approximately 12:40 a.m., members of the Central East Division Criminal Investigations Branch, with the assistance of the Tactical Support Unit, executed a search warrant at a residence in Oshawa. The suspect driver was located inside the residence and taken into custody without incident. At this time, this appears to be an isolated incident as both the accused and victim are known to each other. **Carter William BOYCE**, age 28 from Oshawa is charged with: Dangerous Operation - Cause Bodily Harm, Aggravated Assault, and Fail to Remain at Accident - Cause Bodily Harm. **Major Single Vehicle Collision in Pickering** Two suffer serious injuries following a single vehicle collision in Pickering. On Friday, August 14, 2026, at approximately 2:05 a.m., members of West Division responded to a single vehicle collision in the area of Altona Road and Kingston Road. A Nissan sedan was travelling southbound on Altona Road at Kingston Road when it lost control, left the roadway, and rolled over. Officers arrived on scene and located the Nissan sedan flipped on its side. Two trapped occupants were subsequently extricated by Emergency Services. The 18-year-old passenger was transported to a Toronto-area trauma centre with life threatening injuries. The 18-year-old driver was transported to a Toronto-area trauma centre, with serious but non-life-threatening injuries. **Project Atlantis Leads to Over 250 Arrests and Significant Drug Seizures in Oshawa** Project Atlantis, a proactive

enforcement and community engagement initiative, has led to hundreds of arrests, significant drug seizures, and increased police visibility in Downtown Oshawa. Between April and July 2026, members of the Central East Division Community Resource Unit worked alongside community partners to address public safety concerns through targeted enforcement, intelligence-led investigations, and ongoing engagement with residents, businesses, and community organizations. A key focus of Project Atlantis has been disrupting the sale and distribution of illicit drugs that contribute to addiction, violence, victimization, and community disorder. Throughout the initiative, officers completed more than 1,300 hours of bicycle patrol, 160 hours of foot patrol, 64 hours of UTV patrol, and nearly 100 hours dedicated to youth and school engagement. These highly visible patrols enhanced police presence in the downtown core, waterfronts, trails, and parks. Project Atlantis will continue to operate until the end of 2026. As a result of Project Atlantis, between April and July 2026, officers:

- Made 267 arrests
- Issued 225 Provincial Offence Notices
- Responded to 218 calls for service
- Conducted 289 business and community engagement visits

Project Atlantis also resulted in several significant drug investigations and seizures. Through enforcement efforts, officers seized:

- Approximately 45 grams of fentanyl
- Approximately 674 grams of cocaine
- Approximately 12 grams of crack cocaine
- More than \$10,000 in proceeds of crime

Project Atlantis demonstrates our ongoing commitment to enhancing community safety through proactive policing, enforcement, and meaningful partnerships. **Youth Arrested After Attempted Stabbing in Oshawa** A 13-year-old male is facing charges after attempting to stab another youth during an altercation in Oshawa. On Tuesday, July 28, 2026, at

approximately 7:50 p.m., members of Central West Division responded to an armed person call at the McDonalds restaurant located at 2585 Thoroughbred Street. Two youth were involved in an altercation when a 13-year-old male brandished a knife and attempted to stab a 16-year-old male before the victim was able to flee. The suspect fled the area prior to police arrival. The victim did not suffer any physical injuries. The suspect was located at his residence where he was taken into custody without incident. Investigators later executed a search warrant at the suspect's residence and found the knife used in the incident. A 13-year-old male from Oshawa is charged with: Assault with a Weapon, Assault, and Possess Weapon Dangerous. **Male Arrested in Stolen Vehicle with Drugs in Pickering** A male is facing stolen vehicle and drug charges following an investigation in Pickering. On Wednesday, July 22, 2026, at approximately 4:30 p.m., members of West Division responded to an assist police call regarding a stolen vehicle in Pickering. At the same time, police received information that a white Genesis SUV was driving in a dangerous manner and at high speeds. Officers located the vehicle parked in the area of Liverpool Road and Kingston Road. The driver was observed exiting the vehicle and taken into custody without incident. A search of the suspect located a quantity of cocaine. Further investigation revealed that the vehicle had previously been towed by 'East Side Towing' to what was believed to be the auto repair business 'AutoFix' in Georgina, Ontario. The vehicle was reported stolen after the owner attended the location for 'AutoFix' and discovered the business did not exist. **Nithoosan SELVAKUMAR**, age 35 from Toronto is charged with: Dangerous Operation, Possess Property Obtained by Crime Over \$5000, Obstruct Peace Officer, Possession of Schedule I Substance (cocaine), Drive Motor Vehicle with Open Container of Liquor, and Drive Motor Vehicle While Suspended.

Male Arrested After Assaulting Two GO Transit Employees in Oshawa

A male is facing charges after assaulting two GO Transit employees in Oshawa. On Thursday, July 9, 2026, at approximately 12:50 a.m., members of Central West Division responded to an assault call at the Oshawa GO Station located at 915 Bloor Street West. A male was directed by GO Transit personnel to leave the property. The male suspect refused and assaulted two GO Transit employees before fleeing the area. Officers arrived on scene, and with the assistance of the K9 Unit and Air1, searched the area. A short time later, the suspect was located hiding in dense brush and tall grass by the K9 Unit, who took him into custody without incident. The victims suffered minor injuries. **Emmerson John FORRESTER**, age 19 from Oshawa is charged with: Assault x2.

Serious Injuries After Collision in Whitby

Two suffer serious injuries following head-on collision in Whitby. On Friday, July 17, 2026, at approximately 2:15 p.m., members of Central West Division responded to a two-vehicle collision in the area of Lake Ridge Road and Highway 407. A Hyundai SUV was travelling southbound on Lake Ridge Road near Highway 407 while a Mitsubishi SUV was exiting the Highway 407 off-ramp. The Mitsubishi SUV appeared to enter the intersection, causing the Hyundai SUV to veer out of its lane, resulting in a head-on collision with a Dodge minivan travelling northbound on Lake Ridge Road. The 24-year-old driver of the Hyundai SUV suffered life-threatening injuries and was transported to a Toronto-area trauma centre. A 77-year-old passenger in the Dodge minivan suffered critical but non-life-threatening injuries and was transported to a Toronto-area trauma centre. The 69-year-old driver of the Dodge minivan suffered minor injuries and was transported to a local area hospital.
