



Ontario Protecting Young Victims and Witnesses of Crime

OSHAWA — The Ontario government is investing \$600,000 over three years to help

protect child victims and witnesses of crime in Durham Region. The funding is part of the government's \$4.2 million investment to expand the Child Victim Witness Program to more communities across the province.

Victim Services Durham will deliver the Child Victim Witness Program to help empower young victims and witnesses, under the age of 18 years, by reducing the potential trauma associated with testifying in court. The Child Victim Witness Program is available in 15 communities across the province.
