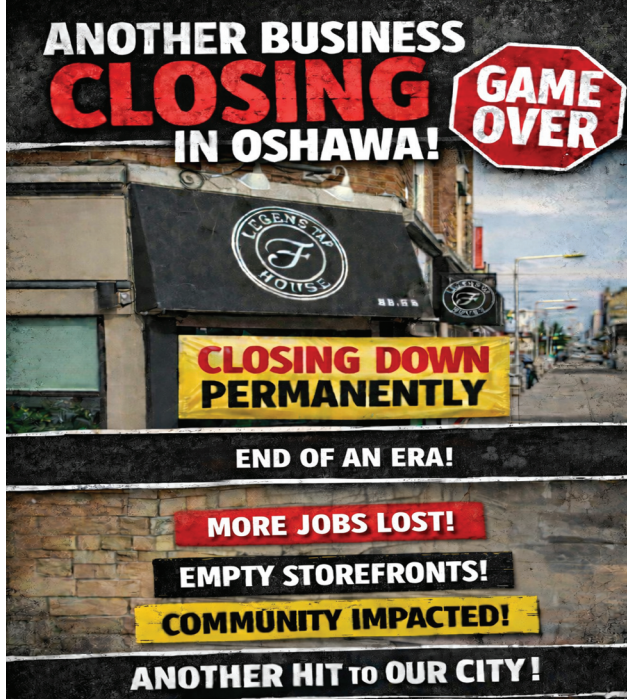

## LEGEND OF FAZIO'S FAMOUS LOCAL RESTAURANT FORCED TO CLOSE HUGE BLOW TO OSHAWA DOWNTOWN

OSHAWA - When things looked like they could not get any worse for downtown Oshawa. The Legend of Fazio's, is the latests business to close its doors for good. Legends of Fazio's opened in 2019, two years after the original Fazio's - a mainstay in the core for 40 years especially known for an extensive wine cellar of more than 20,000 bottles - closed when Tino Fazio retired and sold the building at 33 Simcoe St. S. Legend of Fazio's was a full service Italian Steakhouse located in the heart of Oshawa's Simcoe neighborhood at 33 Simcoe St. It re-opened in 2019, as the Legend of Fazio's offering similar meals at that to the original Fazio's. With the hope to carry the name...The Legend of Fazio was born. The new owners originally from Toronto, came to Oshawa to work with a friend, and after six months, started looking around for a potential location. Thas Thurairasa the new owner of 'Legends of Fazio' right from the get go encountered many obstacles that the original Fazio's did not have to deal with. From the lack of street parking to the change in the menu. The old Fazio's clientele did not respond as well as anticipated. One of the biggest obstacles was the change to the core cosmetics. A high end restaurant in a downtown core that did not support it and crime riddled. From the homeless on the street to the fear of being robbed. People just stop coming to the core and in turn visiting his once buzzing spot. The notice from the bailiff, dated April 10, said the locks have been changed and entry to remove personal property would only be done with the permission of the



landlord - WJW Canada Inc. of Thornhill. The sign said the business owes \$69,911.94 in back rent and that it has five days to remove any assets before they go into storage. So far there is not sign of Fazio coming back any time soon. The realities of the core are taking out one business at the time. The local Chamber has proven to have no affect when it comes to promoting the core. Oshawa economic department has lost touch with the cores needs. Local councillor Rick Kerr is more interested in supporting the arts then local businesses. City councillor Derek Giberson has shown to be anti-downtown businesses and more pro-homeless open drug use. The downtown merchants are left to fend for themselves with no walk in traffic.
