## Over \$21,000 grant from Firehouse Subs Foundation boosts safety for Clarington firefighters

Clarington, Ontario — Clarington Emergency & Fire Services (CEFS) welcomed a \$21,865 grant from the Firehouse Subs Public Safety Foundation of Canada. As Station 1 (Bowmanville) expands into a two-truck hall to better serve the community, the funding enabled the addition of a new gear extractor unit.

Gear extractors are specialized systems that remove harmful substances from bunker gear after exposure to smoke, chemicals, and other fire-related debris. This brings the total to five gear cleaning systems now in place across CEFS stations. The extractor aligns with best practices outlined in Ontario's firefighter cancer prevention checklist and industry best practices, underscoring Clarington's commitment to health and
