A female working as a self-employed cleaner is facing theft charges after stolen jewelry was recovered in her possession in Bowmanville. In September 2025, members of the East Division Criminal Investigations Branch began an investigation into a female believed to be responsible for several thefts and break-and-enters. The suspect was working as a self-employed cleaner, operating under the business name ‘Maids to Us.’ Investigators believe the suspect used her position as a cleaner to gain access to homes, targeting older-aged clientele. On Friday, October 10, 2025, a search warrant was executed at the suspect’s residence. A large quantity of jewelry, believed to be linked to multiple incidents, was located. Police have concerns there are additional victims, and are urging anyone who may have hired the suspect to clean their home to contact investigators. **Danielle Margarita JARRETT**, age 41 from Clarington is charged with:

Break-and-Enter, Theft Under \$5000, Possess Property Obtained by Crime Under \$5000, and Fail to Comply with Undertaking x2.

On Thursday, October 16, 2025, at approximately 4:10 p.m., members of Central West Division responded to a collision in the area of Windfields Farm Drive and Bandsman Crescent. A 12-year-old male pedestrian attempted to cross the roadway and was struck by a Chevrolet travelling southbound on Windfields Farm Drive. The 12-year-old pedestrian suffered serious non-life-threatening injuries and was transported to a local-area hospital. The 16-year-old driver of the Chevrolet remained on scene.

An explosive device has been rendered safe after being located on a foot path in Oshawa. On Wednesday, October 15, 2025, at approximately 4:20 p.m., members of Central East Division responded to a suspicious package call on a foot path in the area of Gibb



Street and Centre Street South. Police received reports that an unidentified package with wiring and warning labels was located on the walking path. A perimeter was set up and all pedestrians were evacuated from the immediate area. The DRPS Tactical Support Explosive Disposal Unit (EDU) attended and located what appeared to be military ordinance. A Department of National Defence (DND) Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) specialist was consulted and attended the scene. DND confirmed that the ordinance was a World War II era bomb. DND officials with the assistance of DRPS removed the ordinance, which was transported to a Canadian Forces military base to be rendered safe.

A pedestrian is in critical condition after being struck by a vehicle in Port Perry. On Wednesday, October 15, 2025, at approximately 7:30 p.m., members of North Division responded to a collision in the area of Simcoe Street and Queen Street. A Dodge SUV was northbound on Simcoe Street when a 74-year-old male pedestrian was struck while attempting to cross the roadway. The pedestrian suffered serious life-threatening injuries and was transported via Air Ornge to a Toronto-area trauma centre. The driver of the Dodge was uninjured and remained on scene.

A male is in custody following an investigation into multiple sexual assaults in Whitby. On Saturday, August 17, 2024, at approximately 11:15 p.m., members of Central West Division responded to the area of Wentworth Street and Thickson Road South

after a victim reported being sexually assaulted. The victim was in the area of Quebec Street in Oshawa, when she was approached by the suspect who offered her a ride. The victim was driven to an industrial area in Whitby where the suspect sexually assaulted her. On Sunday, January 12, 2025, at approximately 4:05 a.m., members of Central West Division responded to the area of Victoria Street East and Thickson Road South after a victim reported being sexually assaulted. The victim was in the area of Simcoe Street South and Hall Street in Oshawa, when she was approached by the suspect who offered her a ride. The suspect drove the victim to the area of Moore Court and William Smith Drive in Whitby, where he sexually assaulted her. On Tuesday, October 14, 2025, the suspect was taken into custody without incident. Police have concerns there are other victims.

STREET-LEVEL
ROBBERY IN
OSHAWA

Five youths have been arrested after a street-level robbery in Oshawa involving a firearm. On Friday, September 5, 2025, members of Central East Division responded to an armed person call in the area of William Lott Drive and Greenhill Avenue in Oshawa. Officers arrived on scene and spoke with the victim who advised he had been riding

his bicycle when a group of youths approached him and began assaulting him, during the assault one of the suspects pointed a firearm toward the victim. The suspects proceeded to steal some of the victim’s belongings and fled the scene.

On Wednesday, October 8, 2025 members of DRPS East Criminal Investigation Branch arrested all suspects involved. A 12-year-old female from Oshawa is charged with: Robbery / Offensive Weapon and Possess Weapons Dangerous to Public Peace. A 13-year-old male and a 13-year-old female from Oshawa are charged with: Robbery / Offensive Weapon and Possess Weapons Dangerous to Public Peace. Two, 15-year-old males from Oshawa are charged with: Robbery / Offensive Weapon and Possess Weapon Dangerous to Public Peace.

Police are looking for at least one suspect after shots were fired in Oshawa. On Saturday, October 11, 2025, at approximately 10:50 a.m., members of Central East Division responded to an armed person call in the residential area of Annis Street and Douglas Street. Two vehicles were located with bullet holes, and several bullet casings were located on the roadway.

Police are investigating after an armed robbery at a convenience store in Oshawa. On Friday, October 10, 2025, at approximately 8:30 p.m., members of Central East Division responded to a robbery at Circle K, located at

1051 Simcoe Street North. Two suspects entered the store and brought an item to the cash for purchase. While the female suspect paid, the male suspect pointed a firearm at the employee and ordered the employee to hand over cash.

The suspects stole a quantity of cash and fled the area prior to police arrival.

Police are investigating Durham Region’s seventh homicide after a male was located deceased outside of a residence in Oshawa.

On Thursday, October 16, 2025, at approximately 4:20 p.m., members of Central East Division responded to an unknown trouble call in the area of Mcgrigor Street and Simcoe Street South. Officers arrived on scene and located a male with obvious signs of trauma. Life saving measures were performed, however, the male was pronounced deceased.

The victim has been identified as 80-year-old Ibrahim BALA of Oshawa. The Homicide Unit has taken over the investigation and is urging anyone with information to come forward.

We are aware of the proximity of this incident to a nearby place of worship. As with all criminal investigations, our investigators are examining all potential motives. We remain in close contact with leaders from the Islamic Centre of Oshawa and the community to ensure the investigation is conducted with sensitivity, respect, and transparency. We understand this incident has had a significant impact on members of the Muslim community and the broader public. Our thoughts remain with the victim’s family, friends, and all those affected.

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
