2024 Policy Committee Summary & Strategies Report

Overview

On January 25, 2024, the Florida Supportive Housing Coalition Policy Committee hosted a facilitated session with Committee members. This session was conducted to develop recommendations for the recently approved Statewide Permanent Supportive Housing Action Plan and to provide advocacy guidance for the Coalition's new Executive Director. This summary report highlights suggested Policy Committee strategies and associated activities as a result of this session.

Advocacy Position for Supportive Housing Development in Florida

The Florida Supportive Housing Coalition's Policy Committee offers and supports the following supportive housing development proposal for Florida:

- Address the historic under production of supportive housing units estimated at 15,000 (based on need for 12,811 units in 2021 statewide needs assessment and an estimated additional 2,189 units) by doubling supportive housing production every two years until unmet need is addressed
- Develop additional supportive housing units annually commensurate with Florida's population growth
- Preserve existing supportive housing units
- Form a Coordinated State Entity in accordance with state workgroup recommendations
- Create a Supportive Housing Trust Fund, with a dedicated source, to be administered by Coordinated State Entity to align housing, rental assistance, and services resources
- Have Coordinated State Entity to continue to assess supportive housing need, track inventory, and facilitate growth



NEXT STEPS:

- 1. Coalition Executive Director, Policy Committee Chair, and Policy Committee designee(s) meet with Governor's staff and present proposal
- 2. Proposal recommendations presented in alignment with the formation of a Coordinated State Entity and the creation of a dedicated Supportive Housing Trust Fund for Florida
