FLMHAC's #1 Legislative Priority: 9-8-8

An opportunity to transform the behavioral health crisis response system

What is 9-8-8?

9-8-8 is a new three-digit national number that will link callers to the nation's National Suicide Prevention Hotline, starting on July 16, 2022.

9-8-8 was enacted as a federal law to serve as both a universal telephone number for national suicide prevention AND mental health crisis hotline system.

The Vision for 9-8-8

Behavioral health advocates around the country are working to create a three-tiered crisis response system that can quickly link callers to behavioral health support and resources. This system will include:

1. SOMEONE TO CALL

Well-trained call-takers who can effectively handle mental health, substance use, and suicidal crises for veterans and the general population.

2. SOMEONE TO RESPOND

Mobile Response Teams, staffed by trained professionals and peers, able to respond in person on a 24/7 basis.

3. SOMEWHERE TO GO

Individuals in crisis can receive short-term (23 hour) stabilization services and be assessed at Centralized Receiving Facilities or other crisis stabilization centers.

How Do We Get There?

This new type of behavioral health crisis response system requires dedicated funding for expanding existing National Suicide Prevention Lifeline call centers, mobile response teams, and crisis receiving facilities.
