“ELECTION TIME IS HERE”

Elected Officer positions are: Governor, Junior Governor, Prelate, Administrator, Treasurer, and Three Trustees who are active members of the Lodge in which they are elected. No Officer may serve more than two consecutive years in the same office unless the General Governor issues a dispensation.

A candidate wishing to run for a particular office must fill out an application. Applications can be obtained from the Lodge Administrator. The Administrator will then present all application forms to the Nominating Committee by March 18, 2019. The Election will be held at the General Membership meeting on Monday, April 8, 2019.

The elected officers take office at midnight on April 20, 2019.

Prospective candidates who get elected to the Office that they applied for must make a commitment to perform the responsibilities of their elected office. By doing so, we are assuring the membership that they elected a dedicated management team to manage their Lodge for the 2019-2020 term.

We will not be electing a new Administrator. An Administrator remains in office until he does not fulfill his duties and responsibilities pertaining to his office, and the membership and officers wish to replace him. We do not have that problem. Fortunately, we have a very exceptional Administrator. The position requires dedication and time and Don Thompson provides both. Hopefully, we will have our own Lodge before the elected Officers complete their term of office.

Be Vigilant



Remain vigilant in our daily lives. Do not be caught off guard, when you should be alert at all times. Trust your instincts and gut feelings. Recognize potentially dangerous situations and try to avoid them.

If there is an escape plan, make an attempt to use it. Leave whether others agree or not; split seconds to think. Leave your stuff behind. Help others if possible. Call 911 when you are safe. Give a location and physical description of the assailant(s). Name the number of weapons involved and the number of victims if any. Get out of there fast and be safe.

Segments of our society are inherently open to the general public, and by nature of their purpose do not incorporate strict security measures. Given the increased emphasis by terrorists and others to leverage less sophisticated methods to inflict harm in public areas, it is vital that the public and private sectors collaborate to enhance security of locations such as transportation centers, parks, restaurants, shopping centers and special event venues.

On Thursday February 7th, Police arrested a gunman who was caught on video trying to rape a cleaning lady as she cleaned an office in Irvine, California. The incident began when the suspect entered the office through an unlocked door around 1:20a.m. Wednesday. He approached the woman and asked her in Spanish if she was alone. She said yes. Police said that he pulled a gun and allegedly ordered the victim to have sex with him. The cleaning lady refused, pleaded for her life and fought the assailant off. She was able to overpower and disarm him. Detectives released the footage.



As a last resort if your life is in danger, fight. Act aggressive; improvise anything that could be a weapon. Then commit to your actions. Throw things. Scream. Yell! When there is no other way, fight for your life.

When the authorities arrive, remain calm and follow instructions. Keep your hands visible. The life you save, maybe your own.
