


2021 Mid-Year Virtual Conference

The 87th Annual Mid-Year Conference of the California/Nevada Moose Association was called to order on March 20, 2021. No sooner than possible, everyone at the conference was reminded that a new era was coming on May 1, 2021: ONE MOOSE-Men and Women combined. The virtual originated at the Stockdale Moose Lodge in Bakersfield, California with 356 Delegates who registered.

The meeting went through its usual drill: Explanation of Roll Call by Cheryl Volden, Association Secretary, Reading of the Minutes, Presentation of the Association By-Laws and Association Policy manual.



There was a video presentation on ONE MOOSE with remarks from Scott Hart, Director General, Barb McPherson, Grand Chancellor and Mike Rios, Director of Membership.

***UPDATE ON "One Moose" from Moose Int. ***


During the 132nd Meeting of the Supreme Lodge, delegates voted favorably to pass a set of General Law Amendments that would essentially create a new and unified Moose membership where all members, male and female, would have equal opportunities, rights, and privileges within the Lodge. Nearly 77% of the delegates voted in favor of moving to a unified Moose membership, easily surpassing the 67% majority necessary for adoption. The changes are scheduled to go into effect on May 1, 2021 and will impact the membership in the following ways:

For the Lodge:

Women will become members of the Lodge automatically on May 1, 2021. Women may become elected to the Board of Officers beginning May 1, 2022; however, qualified women may be eligible or appointed to open positions on the Board or committees beginning May 1, 2021. Individual title changes will occur for the Lodge Officers, including "President" for Governor; "Vice President" for Junior Governor; "Chaplain" for Prelate and "Past Lodge President" for Past Lodge Governor. Any member, man or woman, may serve in the new positions as long as they are a member of either the Moose Legion or the newly structured Women of the Moose, or join within 60 days. All previous honors will transition seamlessly to the new integrated Moose, i.e. any member receiving the honor of Past Lodge Governor shall enjoy all the rights and privileges of any Past Lodge President of The Moose. The revised Laws for Moose Social Quarters and Homes (Section IV) eliminates the House Committee; those duties will now be performed by the Lodge's Board of Officers. An Executive Session has been added to every Board of Officer's meeting, if necessary, to discuss confidential topics (i.e. personnel matters, legal matters, etc.), including issues previously handled by the House Committee. The minimum proposed dues amount for the Lodge will be \$38, although Lodges have the option to set higher dues amounts.

For the Chapter:

The Women of the Moose will be structured similarly as the Moose Legion; as an affiliated unit of the new Moose lodge. The WOTM will maintain all honors, charitable focus, lower dues and influence. Chapters will retain their current assets, without turning monies over to the Lodge. The minimum proposed dues amount for the chapter is \$15, although Chapter dues are waived for the first three years of the transition to the One Moose lodge structure.



GLENDALE MOOSE LODGE HONORS TWO PILGRIMS ON MOOSEHEART'S VETERAN'S WALK

Mooseheart's Veterans Walk, opened May 2012, is a walkway tribute to men and women who serve and have served our country through military duty. It is a personal "thank you for your service" to family members, friends or fellow Moose members who have served so proudly and bravely. The Veterans Walk is for all veterans, not just those who are deceased or who served during wartime. Flags can be purchased as a remembrance or as an honorary gift.

Mooseheart's NJROTC unit has complete responsibility of the flag walk. Cadets assemble and set in place your gift of an American flag and engraved name plate each Memorial Day Weekend in May and week of Veterans Day in November. American flags will line the sidewalks leading from Centennial Plaza to the House of God. Members and guests are welcome to walk through the Veterans Walk between 9am– 5pm each day that the American flags are displayed.

The following requirements must be met in order to be eligible for the Moose - The Heart of the Community Scholarship Program.

The applicant must:

Be a student of the high school graduating Class of 2022 (to be verified by a high school official).

^r Have a father, mother, step-parent, grandparent or legal guardian who is a current member of the Moose in good standing (Applicant is NOT required to reside in the same household).

Have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale or equivalent verified by a copy of student's transcript.

(Completing the above criteria qualifies for a chance for a \$1,000 scholarship.)

If the applicant completes one or more of the optional criteria below. He/she will qualify for a chance for a <u>\$5,000</u> scholarship:

In-School / Extra-Curricular activities (i.e. school sports teams, band, chess club, theater, etc.)



 To satisfy this requirement a school official must verify this by completing their section of the application.

Out-of-School activities (i.e. employment, scouting programs, music lessons, non-school related sports)

To satisfy this requirement Moose International must receive a letter or email from the student's supervising adult (boss, troop leader, etc.) no later than June 30, 2021. The letter should include: 1) The name, title, email, and phone number of the supervising adult;
2) Details of the student's participation; 3) The type of activities they engaged in; and,
4) The dates/date range of their participation.

Volunteer on behalf of a fraternal unit of the Moose. (To be verified by Lodge Administrator, Chapter Recorder or Moose Legion Secretary on the application or by email, fax or U.S. mail.)
