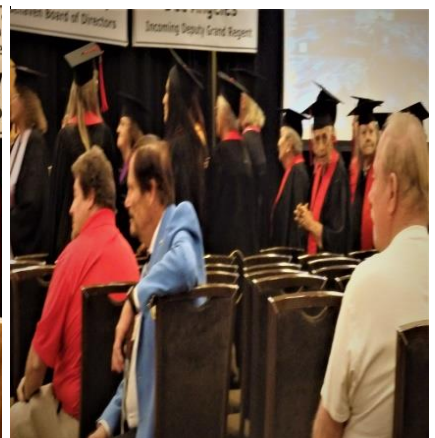

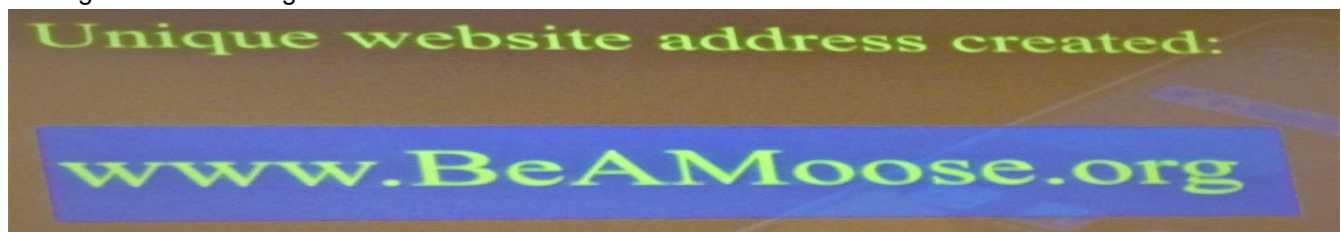

2020, HERE WE COME

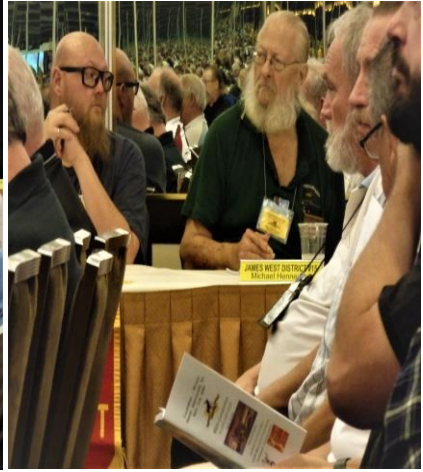

Moose Riders presented a check to Moose Charities and before lunch there was the March of Checks.

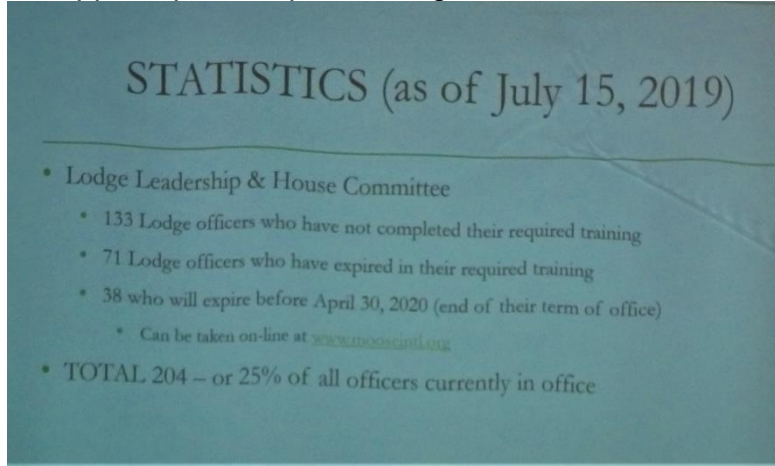

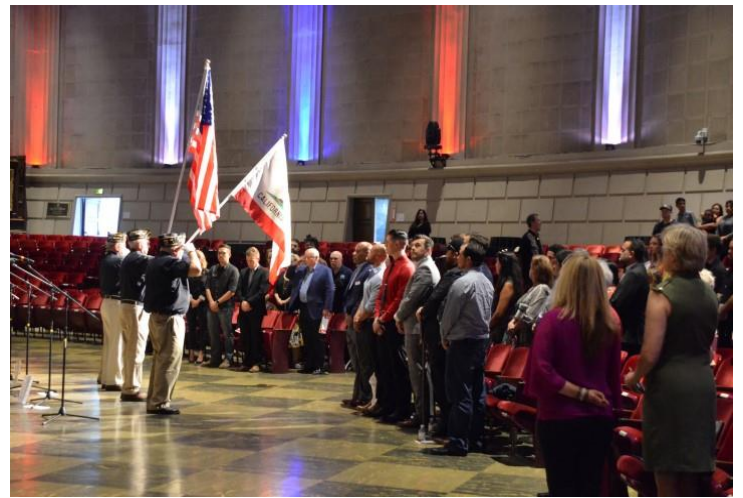
