



## Winter Storm Management



Winter storm management is considered emergency work and must occur regardless of the time of day (or night). Contractors will often work through the night if necessary to ensure that streets are reasonably safe. Residents are advised to stay clear of crews and off the streets until clearing/treating has been completed.

The goal of the Maple Pointe Homeowners Association's Winter Storm Management Plan is to make streets reasonably safe and accessible within a certain timeframe once the snow stops falling. However, residents are to be warned that during and after the storm streets and sidewalks may be snow packed and/or icy. Maple Pointe Homeowners Association has set the following goals as part of the management plan for clearing the streets. Homeowners are required to shovel their sidewalks for safety.

ACTUAL ACCUMULATION	MAPLE POINTE PRIVATE STREETS
0-2 inches	Salting will be done as needed. Streets will be inspected and plowed as necessary.
2-4 inches	Plowing will begin within 6 hours after storm ends.
4-8 inches	Plowing will begin within 8 hours after storm ends.
8-12 inches	Plowing will begin within 16 hours after storm ends.
12-18 inches	Plowing will begin within 30 hours after storm ends, if VDOT declares streets are passable.  Piled snow may be relocated or removed from site by loader and dump trucks.
18-24 inches	Plowing will begin within 2 days after storm ends, if VDOT declares streets are passable.  Piled snow may be removed from site by loader and dump trucks.
24+ inches	Plowing will begin within 4 days after storm ends, if VDOT declares streets are passable.  Piled snow may be removed from site by loader and dump trucks.
