October has been an excellent month for our school, truly showcasing our values in action as we focus on accountability, growth, and teamwork.



Most importantly, we've watched our school values blossom in every corner of the classroom. From kindness and curiosity to resilience and respect. What a joy it is to witness their understanding grow and be demonstrated so naturally each day.

Willow class





This month in Willow Class, the boys have been busy becoming historians, scientists, and chefs, diving into handson learning with enthusiasm and creativity.

We love an experiment in Willow Class! The boys have explored chemical reactions by making a volcano erupt, investigated how different liquids affect eggshells—a fun way to learn about tooth enamel—and discovered how adding salt to water increases its density, making objects float.

Our culinary adventures began with fruit salads, where the boys practised their chopping skills and learned about healthy eating. Next came soup-making, which turned into a freestyle cooking session! While the soup may not have been a hit in flavour, their chopping skills definitely improved. We wrapped up with cookie baking, where they worked on weighing ingredients, and reading scales.

We also enjoyed a lovely trip to the local library, where the children spoke with staff, received their very own library cards, and chose books to bring back to school. It was a wonderful way to encourage a love of reading and introduce them to the joy of borrowing books.

Another highlight was our trip to the local park, where the boys explored the gym equipment and compared their

heart rates at rest and after exercise.





Beech class

Beech Class have been as busy as ever! In Literacy, we've been exploring story sequencing and enjoyed listening to The Very Hungry Caterpillar, using pictures to retell the story in order.

In PSHE, we've been thinking about activities we like and dislike, sharing our thoughts and learning to respect each other's preferences. Dressing up was a huge hit! From princesses to Marvel and Star Wars characters, the children had a fantastic time choosing costumes and role-playing different characters with their friends.

In Cooking, we created delicious salad pitta breads. The children practised washing, chopping, and peeling vegetables with care and concentration—what a tasty way to learn!

In Maths, we've been exploring a range of concepts including tall and short, heavy and light, positional language, and tally marking. The children have shown great enthusiasm and curiosity throughout.

In Science, we've been discovering our five senses—exploring one each week through hands-on activities and discussions. The children have loved identifying how we use our senses in everyday life.

These points will be tracked using the Class Dojo platform, so parents can follow their child's progress and celebrate their achievements at home. You'll notice new skills being added to Dojo that reflect our school values, helping children understand and live by them every day.

At the end of each term, the house with the highest score will be crowned the House Champions and rewarded with a special prize — such as an extra community visit or a fun experience that celebrates their success.
