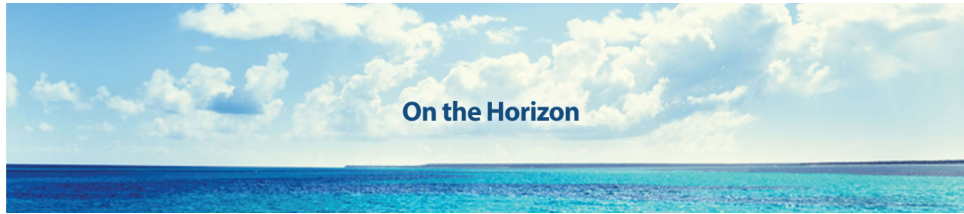
I am back from my trip, and I don't at this time have any long term travel plans to
