Cruising the Maine Island Trail: A Late Summer Sail in Belfast, ME

Earlier this month, I had the pleasure of joining my brother for a short sailing escape out of Belfast, Maine aboard his 36-foot Gulfstar Center Cockpit sailboat. With the summer season winding down, we were lucky to encounter classic New England conditions—light morning fog, crisp air, and steady afternoon breezes that filled the sails from 2 to 4 PM each day.

Our route took us along the Maine Island Trail, a network of wild coastal islands. Many of the islands are privately owned and allow boaters to camp overnight. We moored overnight at two idyllic spots: Warren Island in Islesboro, ME which



offers 11 mooring balls, 5 campsites and a peaceful forested shoreline, and Holbrook Island Sanctuary State Park, a quieter spot with just three moorings, no camping and a more rugged charm. Both locations provided calm anchorages and sunset views. \$20 donation is all they ask.

One night we grilled swordfish on deck as the sun dipped below the horizon, casting a stream of light across Penobscot Bay. The Gulfstar's center cockpit made for comfortable cruising and the combination of the wind and water reminded us of why we enjoy sailing the coast of Maine. Whether you're planning a northern charter or just dreaming of your next voyage, the Maine coast offers a perfect blend of adventure and tranquility. I highly recommend it for anyone looking to explore




northern waters.

## MSA REVISITS A LOCAL SUCCESS STORY THE DRUM CIRCLE DISTILLERY

On September 30<sup>th</sup> 2025, MSA members made the trek through the back roads of an industrial park hidden just off University Parkway in search of the now famous Drum

Circle Distillery which was house and home to the production of Siesta Key Rum. This was not a first time for some of us as the distillery has just celebrated its 18<sup>th</sup> anniversary. And through the years, MSA has toured and tasted



the progress of our local gem and listened to its story more than once.

Drum circle Distillery is a craft distillery located in our back yards just down the road in Sarasota. It is here that the production of Siesta Key Rum takes place. Over the years, the rum has won many international awards and has received praise from the Caribbean Journal, Forbes, Wine Enthusiast, Cooking Light Magazine and several other publications. The small batch rum is a true gem in the industry capturing the essence of the Caribbean in every sip.



For starters, the distillery uses only real ingredients beginning with the highest grade of Florida molasses available. Never using pre-fab flavor packets,



Siesta Key Rum is made with fresh ground spices and honey. And it doesn't take a professional to taste the difference. In addition, Siesta Key Rum takes great pride in using locally sourced ingredients to create their flavorful spirits. By supporting local farmers and producers, Siesta Key Rum not only delivers a delicious product but also contributes to the sustainability of the surrounding community.



At the heart of Siesta Key Rum is the visionary distiller, Troy Roberts. With a passion for crafting top-notch spirits, Roberts has dedicated his life to perfecting the art of rum-making. He is the driving force behind the success of Siesta Key Rum with his relentless pursuit of excellence and unwavering commitment to quality. One of the things that sets Siesta Key Rum apart is



its commitment to small batch production. Unlike mass produced rums, Siesta Key Rum is meticulously

crafted in limited quantities to ensure that every bottle meets the highest standards. This attention to detail combined with Roberts expertise results in a rum that is truly exceptional.

Siesta Key rum seamlessly blends tradition and innovation. Roberts incorporates techniques that have been passed down through generations of rum makers ensuring that the spirit stays true to its Caribbean roots. Yet, he also embraces modern innovations to enhance flavors. One of the standout features of this distillery is its aging process. Through the "solera process" of multi level barrels, new rum is added to the top and older rum is gradually moved down and eventually bottled from the bottom level. This fractional blending creates a consistent and complex flavor profile by continually mixing rums of different ages ensuring that a small portion of very old rum remains in the system with each bottling.

We heard the history of this success story from 3 charming guides who filled our heads with facts and figures all while telling amusing tales of mishaps and failures. But the proof was in the taste tests and we tried almost all the different rums from Spiced to Toasted Coconut to Coffee flavored that the distillery produced and offered. We visited the distillery tasting room on arrival, at first to awaken our curiosity and at the end, to savor their accomplishment. This was my

third visit to the Drum Circle Distillery and although a lot has changed over the years, I felt privileged to



have personally witnessed this hometown success story.

Thank you for taking the journey with me.

## November 9<sup>th</sup> at 6 P.M. to 9 P.M. Boomers Dance Night


