SAILING; A DIFFERENT WAY!

We just happened to pick a week of crazy weather to go camping and kayaking!
Well, we didn't pick it exactly! You have to reserve state park sites just about a year in advance and even then you are lucky to actually get in. So the weather was not a consideration. We were going if only to meet up with the other members of Chuck's kayak club. It had been 2 years since we had enjoyed this adventure due to Chuck's unfortunate car accident. I was

a little nervous
myself since this kind
of sport kayaking
was not my forte
especially after such
a long hiatus. But I
loved the camping or
should I say
"glamping"? Staying
in an Airstream
camper is not
roughing it by any
means. Yet, high
winds and probable

rain were forecast to be a part of the deal. But surprisingly, these avid kayakers found streams and rivers that were calm and protected from the elements. I did notice that there was very little visible wildlife which was not normal for this sort of

activity. Maybe the critters knew something we didn't.

So one windy day in south Florida at Jonathan Dickenson State Park the small group left for a nearby creek for a short paddle. As we were driving I noticed a large assembly of people, campers and cars along the



shoreline of a lake across the divided highway. I strained my neck to check out what was going on. Out of the corner of my eye, I could make out little white things flying along the surface of the white

> capped water. I told Chuck, I thought they were small sailboats! Hmmmmm!

> So after our quiet hour or two on the creek and a picnic lunch we drove back toward the campground making a detour to check out what was happening on the lake. After

struggling to find the entrance road, we were met with a long row of International Flags. This looked like a big deal! And it was! We, by accident, found a sailing event! In the middle of nowhere in south Florida, the International One Meter 2023







North American week long Championship was in full swing. 14 countries were represented from all over the world, some as far away as New Zealand. We didn't know much about this kind of sailing activity so we asked lots of questions. The boats were amazingly complex and were radio controlled by competitors stationed on the shore. Both sails and rudders could be adjusted very much like it's grown up versions. Each sailing vessel had 3 sets of sails which were used depending upon the force of the wind and the skills of the operator. As in any kind of sailing, this was an expensive hobby. These one meter sailboats went for \$5000 and up.

The wind gusts this week, sometimes 30 to 40 MPH, blew the vessels hard over on the rough lake water but we never saw one go under. And we noticed that the competitors were just as serious about winning these races as in the America's Cup. We spent several afternoons as the weather deteriorated watching the one meter sailboats perform in challenging conditions. The lesson here was that sometimes the journey can be more exciting than the destination. This sailboat races were the big deal of our kayaking trip. Look what we would have missed!
