(but come early to explore the Civil War campsite and extensive set) on Sunday October 15th



which includes the 1+ hour train ride and the reenactment. Cost is \$20 per ticket which must be obtained in advance because these performances sell-out. We will have a late lunch (about 1 P.M) at the Anna Maria Oyster Bar in Ellenton after the train ride and performance. "See American History as it takes place before your eyes! Come early to visit the authentic camp ground before boarding your train.

The camp grounds open at 10am, and admission to the camp is
