### **Meet Your Executive Committee**

Tim Shepard, Dean Tim Shepard has been Director of Music & Organist at Brevard FUMC since 2008. He is a charter member of the Blue Ridge Chapter and her second and fourth Dean. In addition to playing for worship on Sunday morning, he directs two adult choral groups, supervises children's choirs, directs 5 octave set of handbells, coordinates the annual Christmas Organ Recital Series at the church, and guides a Centering Prayer group. He is a composer and arranger for choirs, handbells, and keyboard music. His music can be found at SacredMusicDownloads.com. He has performed on pipe organs throughout western NC including with the Brevard Philharmonic, Brevard College, Blue Ridge Symphonic Brass, and a recital for the Brevard Music Center. He is excited about the growth of the Blue Ridge AGO Chapter, advocating for the vast musical possibilities of the Organ, and helping our chapter move into the future.





Brennan Szafron, Sub Dean A native of Regina, Saskatchewan, Canada, Brennan Szafron has served as the organist and choirmaster of Holy Cross Episcopal Church in Tryon, NC, since 2021. He leads a varied music ministry which includes an adult choir, a children's choir, and a handbell ensemble. Prior to that, he served for 18 years as the organist and choirmaster of the Episcopal Church of the Advent in Spartanburg, SC. He took the choir on many trips, particularly to New York City, Washington, DC and Lincoln, England where for a week in 2016 the choir was in residence at Lincoln Cathedral. He will be taking a group of singers to England at the end of this August, where they will be the choir in residence at Norwich Cathedral. He maintains his Spartanburg connections as an adjunct instructor of organ and university organist at Converse University and as the principal keyboardist with the Spartanburg Philharmonic. He performs frequently as an accompanist with the Spartanburg Master Chorale

and in North Carolina, he has rung for three years with the Blue Ridge Ringers handbell ensemble. In August 2024, he became the ensemble's assistant director. He holds degrees in organ performance and church music at the University of Alberta (B. Mus. with distinction), Yale University (MM), and the University of Michigan (DMA). Over the years, he has performed frequently as a solo recitalist both locally and nationally. Recently he worked solely as a choral conductor, having been the director of the Community Chorus of Polk County, NC in the spring of 2022 and 2023. He has several videos on YouTube, including the series "Pipe Organs of South Carolina". Dr. Szafron's non-musical passion is the great outdoors. He is an avid hiker and swimmer and has visited all 47 state parks in South Carolina and 90 percent of the state parks in North Carolina. He visits his parents and other family members in Calgary, Alberta whenever possible.



**Thomas Bernard, Treasurer & Registrar** Tom Bernard is a native of New Orleans, Louisiana. He attended Tulane University and after serving three years in the U.S. Navy he returned to Tulane Medical School and practiced Orthopedic Surgery for 35 years in Columbus, Georgia. He and his wife Denise joined the Columbus, Ga., AGO and were members for 15 years where Tom served as chapter treasurer. After retirement and moving to Asheville, the Bernard's joined the BRAGO and they currently volunteer providing music for Funeral Masses at Immaculate Conception Catholic Church in Hendersonville.

JC Cecconi, Secretary JC Cecconi received a BA from Harpur College, SUNY Binghamton, and an MBA in Hospital Administration from Baruch College, CUNY and the Mt. Sinai School of Medicine. He is a former naval

officer, has a private pilot license and is retired from a career in hospital and academic administration. He has held positions as Organist, and Minister of Music in NY churches, and served as the regular organist for several Masonic lodges and Eastern Star chapters. He is a past Dean of the Westchester Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. He resides in Connestee Falls.

Earlier he has been a college faculty member, dean, and academic V.P., and consultant-evaluator on 35 accreditation teams, chairing 18. He has given recitals in Hendersonville and Brevard, served as chair of the Henderson Co. Library Board and president of two local Rotary clubs. He and his wife, Marilyn, have three married sons and eleven grandchildren.

David Anderson, Newsletter and Website Editor David Anderson is the Cantor at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Asheville where he leads the song of the people by playing the organ and piano, and directing the choirs and handbell ensemble. A native of Woodstock, NY, David graduated from Concordia College New York with a BA in English, holds a Certificate in Sacred Music from Lenoir-Rhyne University in Hickory, and is a Colleague of the American Guild of Organists. 




