Margaret Hillis: Unsung Pioneer

We lived in the western Chicago suburbs for 30 years and were always aware of Margaret Hillis and her legendary successes with the Chicago Symphony Chorus and the Elgin Symphony Orchestra. She was born 104 years ago and deserves to be remembered for her contributions to the arts in America.

Miss Hillis, as she was always known and addressed, was born into a wealthy Kokomo IN family; the family wealth (think stainless steel) was a major factor in supporting her professional life. She was a graduate of Indiana University and the Juilliard where she studied with Robert Shaw and was a classmate and then lifelong friend of Alice Parker.

In 1977 Fritz Reiner encouraged her to establish a professional chorus to perform with the CSO. She believed singers were professionals on a par with instrumentalists and should be paid equally. That spirit led to the formation of the ACDA and her membership on the National Endowment of the Arts.



Her recordings earned nine Grammy Awards as testimony to the quality

of her work. Her standing in for an ailing Georg Solti at a 1977 Carnegie Hall performance of Mahler VIII received international attention, one of the first times the world had recognized a woman on the podium.

Another aspect of her Chicago stardom arose from the Do-It-Yourself Messiah for which she asked me to be the organist. One of the Chicago banks generously funded the soloists from the Lyric Opera School, the orchestra principals, harpsichordist David Schrader and me. (Our family had an enhanced Christmas for those 20 years.) The rest of the orchestra were auditioned, but unpaid. There were two, and occasionally three, performances in Orchestra Hall, now Symphony Center. Mandatory tickets were free via WFMT-FM. One year there were 18,000 requests for 5500 tickets. The sound of over two thousand singers was one I will never forget. I may try to forget the sound of "Their Sound is Gone Out" and a few of the lesser-known choruses.

Although Miss Hillis was known and revered by Chicagoans, I have discovered her name here is virtually unknown. She was a dynamo who devoted her life to the cause of choral music. May her contributions be recognized and live on.
