"Who do you [Sing] that I am?" Faces of Christ in African Gospel Music Register now for this Zoom lecture on Monday, October 3 by Nougoutna Norbert Litoing, lecturer at CERAP Jesuit University and Institut de Théologie de la Compagnie de Jésus (Jesuit School of Theology) in Abidjan, Ivory Coast.

Through a study of the lyrics, melodies and video clips of several songs, Litoing will unearth the Christological perspectives extant in African Gospel music that are often more intimately connected with the socio-cultural and economic

realities of Africans than the academic Christology taught in seminaries on the continent. These perspectives are shaped by experiences of what it means to be a Christian in contemporary Africa. Whether he is sung as "best friend", "general", "daddy", "solution", "doctor" or under any other title, Christ's faces express people's unique relationship to him, grounded in their circumstances.

Rachel Laurin to Premiere Winning Composition on October 30 Event will also be Livestreamed

Internationally acclaimed Canadian composer and organist Rachel Laurin, the 2022 Pogorzelski-Yankee Annual Competition winner, will premiere "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow" at Indiana University of Pennsylvania on Sunday, Oct. 30 at 4 p.m. The performance will feature special guest Michael Barone, dancers from the studio of Joan Van Dyke, and illustrations by Cathy Fischer. An Orgelkids demonstration, including original organ literature by Laurin and Vincent Ryan, will follow. The event will be livestreamed and links will be posted on AGO social media channels. The competition honors Ronald G. Pogorzelski and Lester D. Yankee and calls for an original composition for their R.J. Brunner and Co. tracker organ, now installed at Indiana University of Pennsylvania. As winner, Laurin received a \$10,000 cash award and gala premiere of her work.



Bach in Space

Bach in Space: The Glory of God's Creation with an Organ Soundtrack

Retired NASA program manager and organ enthusiast Dan Barstow recently launched the Bach in Space project. Barstow pairs videos of the Earth captured by astronauts aboard the International Space Station with recordings of J.S. Bach masterworks.

"The videos are really stunning," Barstow explained. "To make them more appealing, we're combining them with music of Bach—the master of the harmonies of the universe—and specifically some of his most glorious organ works."

The site, **BachInSpace.org**, already features five videos highlighting mountainous landscapes, oceans, nighttime lights, and the aurora borealis, set to familiar chorale preludes, preludes and fugues, and orchestral transcriptions. There is also one video with no soundtrack, offering users the ability to customize the video. The videos may also be accessed and watched on YouTube.

Barstow has many more videos and hopes to partner with AGO chapters and organists in the future on recordings and special multimedia concerts.
