Stepping Stones
Guided Walks Summer 2024

10th April – Sirhowy Woodlands

Starting our walk from the layby on Thomas Ellis Way, walking through woodlands to the Aneurin Bevan Stones and returning to the start point. **(3 miles)**

24th April – Brynbach Park Circular

Starting from Brynbach Park Visitor Centre, joining the route 46 cycle track, across the Nine Arches and finishing up with a walk around the lake. **(3 miles)**

8th May - Gilwern and Govilion

We commence from Main Road carpark in Gilwern, walking the towpath to Govilon and returning via the disused railway line. **(4 miles)**

22nd May – The Guardian

Starting from Six Bells campus carpark Abertillery, a circular walk around Six Bells with a visit to The Guardian. **(4 miles)**

5th June – Llangynidr Village Walk

Beginning at the village carpark, we have a delightful walk around Llangynidr, returning along the towpath. **(4 miles)**

19th June – Trefil Village Walk

Starting from the rugby club in Trefil, we stroll up through the village, joining the Millgatwg line to the engine pond and the Nant Millgatwg waterfall then returning to the village. **(4 miles)**

3rd July – Glanusk Estate

Commencing from Park Drive Llangattock, joining the canal towpath and on to the Glanusk Estate, finishing up along the river Usk. **(4.5 miles)**

17th July – Dukestown and Rassau Circular

Starting from Crown Avenue Tredegar, this is a circular walk on the hillside above Tredegar. **(4 miles)**

31st July – St. James's Reservoir Circular

Starting from the carpark between Hilltop and Georgetown, a circular walk visiting St. James's reservoir. **(4 miles)**

14th August – Beaufort Hill Woodlands

Starting from Asda carpark Brynmawr, walking up to Beaufort Hill Woodland and returning via the Ebbw Fach Trail. **(5 miles)**

28th August – Llangattock and Crickhowell Castle

Starting from Park Drive Llangattock, we walk through the narrow back streets of Crickhowell to get to the castle and then on to the river Usk, crossing Crickhowell Bridge and back to the start. **(4 miles)**

11th September – Troedrihwgair Circular

Starting from the allotments in Peacehaven Tredegar, this walk takes us down to the village of Troedrihwgair and Bedwellty Pits. **(3 miles)**

18th September – Garn-yr-ew Lakes by moonlight

An end of season finale with a short walk around Garn-yr-ew lakes with the assistance of a hand or head torch. **(2 miles)**
