# 11th May – Symonds Yat and The Wye from above

Starting from Symonds Yat visitors car park, following the River Wye, passing through Lady Park Wood. Mainly a woodland walk until we arrive at the Wye Valley viewpoint (8 miles 3 boot)

#### 25th May - Talgarth & Pwll-y-Wracht

Starting from the main carpark in Talgarth, heading out to Park Cottage and Bradwys Wood, then on to Llaneliau and Rhos Fach Common and finishing up passing through Pwll-y-Wracht Nature Reserve (7.5 miles 3 boot)

#### 8th June - Tintern Abbey

Starting from Tintern Old Station, walking through to Brockwier following the Offas Dyke Path to Devil's Pullpit with views of Tintern Abbey and returning along the river Wye (9 miles 3 boot)

#### 22<sup>nd</sup> June - The Rocking Stone

Starting from Tredegar Shopping Centre carpark, passing through the town, visiting an old cholera cemetery then on to Mynydd Bedwellty and The Rocking Stone, (which was deposited by a glacier) returning via Bedwellty Park (8 miles 4 boot)

#### 6th July - Free Date

#### 20<sup>th</sup> July – Mordiford Loop and Hampton Bishop

Starting from Mordiford, taking in the loop and a lowland walk along the river Wye, returning via Sufton (7 miles 2 boot)

#### 3rd August - Pant y Creigau

Starting from the carpark at the top of Pontstill Reservoir, walking through Cwm Calln, Bryniau Gleison and Pant y Cregiau trigpont, returning via Torpantau Station and Cwm Sychant (8 miles 4 boot)

### 17th August -- Dingestow and Kings Wood

Starting from Dingestow village carpark, walking to Kings Wood and Dinglewood, passing through lower Hendre and returning to the start (7 miles 3 boot)
