Miami, FL – Miami International Fine Arts (MIFA) is thrilled to present "Seeing in You Only What They Wish to See," an evocative exhibition of self-portraits curated by Marco Caridad. The exhibition will run from August 8th to August 29th, 2024, with an opening reception on Thursday, August 8th, from 6 to 9 PM.

This unique exhibition features the works of Elkin Canas, William Alonso, Carlos López, Carlos Martínez León, Milixa Moron, Helen Lupo, Sonia Hidalgo, and Ramiro Sánchez. Through a diverse array of styles and techniques, these artists offer a compelling exploration of identity and belief, using self-portraiture as a mirror that reflects not only their physical appearance but also the depths of their personal convictions and inner worlds.

As curator Marco Caridad highlights through a quote by Diego López Bruzual, "To be a mirror is not easy; we depend too much on what others see in us, reflections of themselves... Then comes a time when one grows tired of telling others how good they look, tired of telling them to stop seeing in you only what they wish to see in themselves." This exhibition challenges viewers to look beyond the surface and consider how our reflections are shaped by both personal and societal influences.
