

Schedule of the Appointed Times Summary

The Earth’s cyclical 24-hour period starts with the daylight phase; however, the schedule of the appointed times varies. They can start from daylight to dawn, dawn through night, daylight to evening, evening through night, or from evening to evening. So, although a day starts from daytime to dawn, the schedule of appointments can start and end at different times.

Appointed Time	Observance Schedule	Description & Reference
<i>Day</i>	Daylight to Dawn	Cycle of 24-hour period starting with daylight and ending at dawn. Genesis 1:1, 14; John 9:4
<i>Morning and Evening Sacrifice</i>	Dawn to Dawn	Two sacrifices every day; first one at dawn, second at evening burned to ashes through the night of the same day. Reference: Leviticus 6:8-13; Numbers 28:1-4
<i>Week</i>	Daylight to Dawn	Cycle of seven 24-hour days periods each starting with daylight and ending dawn. Reference: Genesis 1:1-31; 2:1-3
<i>Regular Work Week</i>	Daylight through Evening	Elohim did all His work only during the daylight phases of days one through six. Reference: Genesis 1:1-31; Exodus 20:9
<i>Sabbath</i>	Daylight through Evening	Elohim finished His work on the sixth day and rested on the daylight phase of the Seventh day. Cycle of seventh daylight to evening of each week. Reference: Genesis 2:1-3; Exodus 16:22-23-26
<i>Month</i>	Daylight to Dawn	Cycle of 30 solar days. Genesis 1:14; Enoch1 72:1-11; Revelation 11:3; 12:6; 13:5
<i>New Month*</i>	Daylight to Dawn	First day of each new month. *Traditionally “new moon” by sickle moon phase. New month is more accurate. First month starts after the spring equinox (in Aviv). Reference: Numbers 28:11-15; 1Samuel 20:5
<i>Passover</i>	Evening to Dawn	Starts on 14 th day of Aviv from evening to dawn. Reference: Exodus 12:5-6, 18, 22; Leviticus 23:5
<i>Feast of Unleavened Bread</i>	Day to Evening	Seven-day feast starting on 15 th of Aviv to the 21 st of Aviv.

		Reference: Exodus 12: 18-20, 42; Leviticus 23:6-8
<i>First Fruits Wave Sheaf</i>	Day to Evening	On the first day of the week, Aviv 26 following 7 th Day of Unleavened Bread. Reference: Leviticus 23:9-14
<i>First Fruits Feast of Weeks</i>	Day to Dawn	On the seventh first day or fiftieth day from Wave Sheaf. Reference: Leviticus 23:21, Acts 2:1
<i>Day of Trumpets</i>	Day to Dawn	First day of the Seventh Month Reference: Leviticus 23:23-25
<i>Day of Atonements</i>	Evening to Evening	Starts the ninth day of seventh month at evening to tenth of seventh month by evening (spread over both dates). Dates start in the day; actual event starts and ends at evening. Reference: Leviticus 23:26-32
<i>Feast Tabernacles and Last Great Day</i>	Daylight to Dawn	Seven-day feast starting 15 th of seventh month to 21 st of seventh month during the day phases. Reference: Leviticus 23:33-43
<i>Year</i>	Daylight to Dawn	364 days starting in Aviv, ending in winter, divided into four seasons, each three months and one additional intercalary* day long. *Possibly, intercalary days are more than only one literal day; in process of verifying that. Reference: Enoch1:72:1-32
<i>Year of Release</i>	Daylight to Dawn	Cycle of every seven years. The first year of the set of seven years starts the day after the Spring Equinox on the fourth day of week marked by a full moon. It repeats the luminary positions of the start of the first year during creation week. Reference: Genesis 1:14; Leviticus 25:1-7; Enoch1 72:1-6-32
<i>Year of Jubilee and Proclamation of Liberty</i>	Day to Evening	Cycle of year after every 7 th Year of Release: ([7 x 7 years = 49] + 1 = 50 years). Proclamation of Liberty done during daylight of the 10 th day of the Seventh month (Day of Atonements) of the 50 th year. Reference: Leviticus 25:8-28
