Figure 1: Louisiana Initial and Continued Unemployment Claims






Figure 2: Louisiana Continued State and Pandemic Unemployment Claims






Figure 3: Continued Unemployment Claims by Industry as Percent of Pre-COVID Employment







Figure 4: Continued Unemployment Claims by Region as Percent of Pre-COVID Employment

LA Unemployment Compensation (UC) Fund Information

How the System Works



- Employers pay state and federal taxes to fund UC benefits and the cost of administering state and federal unemployment systems. Employer state taxes are experience rated.
- State law provides that how much state tax employers pay in Louisiana each calendar year and what UC benefit amount claimants receive will depend, in part, on Louisiana's UC trust fund level. Taxes increase and benefits decrease when the fund declines.
- Whenever the fund reaches a critically low level (below \$100 million), solvency taxes (up to 30% of an employer's tax rate) are "triggered" to protect or restore its solvency.
- The unprecedented rate of the fund's decline due to COVID-19-related benefit claiming the last five months rendered the fund's triggers essentially ineffective.

COVID-19 Impact on the System



- The state's trust fund was approximately \$1.05 billion at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic in March 2020.
- \$873,721,595 in benefits were paid out of the state's UC fund from March 22 July 31, 2020. Enactment of SB 461 (Act 243) in the regular session prevents Louisiana employers having to pay this entire amount next year via the "social charge" tax.
- The fund's current level is just below \$300 million, and weekly claims are running close to \$50 million. At this rate, the Louisiana Workforce Commission (LWC) estimates the trust fund has about 7 weeks of capacity remaining and will run out of money to pay benefits by around mid-September.

Where the System Goes from Here



- Under federal law, Louisiana is obligated to pay weekly unemployment benefits regardless
 of its trust fund balance. So, when the fund becomes insolvent, the LWC must take out
 federal loans to cover these benefits.
- By the end of this week, LWC must make application with US Department of Labor for loans to cover 3 months of its projected UC benefit obligations arising after state trust fund insolvency in September.
- These loans will be interest free only through the end of 2020, unless Congress grants an extension of interest waiver. If waiver is not granted, employers will pay a surtax in July each year to cover any interest accrued on loans through June 30.
- If Louisiana has federal loans outstanding within two years of receiving the first installment, a mandatory federal UC tax increase is triggered to help hasten the payback.
