single moment, written to delight the senses. Haiku invite readers to see an everyday scene in a fresh new way.

Many people enjoy "gingko walks", where they walk in nature, paying close attention to their surroundings. When they come across something catches their breath, they enjoy crafting a short haiku to remember their "aha" moment.

Originating in Japan, haiku was introduced to the US in the 1800's and are now written in nearly every country. "But the haiku didn't have 5-7-5 syllables," some commented at the festival. When haiku were first introduced in the US, they were written with the 5-7-5 format based on Japan's 5-7-5 kana count. But syllables aren't the same as kana, and the 5-7-5 rule relaxed.

The Haiku Trail was sponsored by Montesano Haiku. All haiku were written by Washington poets and were selected by a haiku judge. If writing haiku interests you, Montesano Haiku holds classes. Contact Susan at
