New School Start Time

By emphasising punctuality, we hope to instil a lifelong habit in our students that will serve them well in all areas of life. Please note that **any arrivals after 8:25 am will be marked as late**, and we kindly ask all parents to support us in maintaining this standard.

Lunch Menus and Healthy Eating Initiative

Our lunch menus offer a variety of balanced and nutritious options for students. For those bringing packed lunches, we encourage parents to focus on healthy choices that support our school's commitment to healthy eating. A separate copy of the menus will be emailed to you after the 4th of November.

Examples of good options include: whole grain sandwiches or wraps with lean proteins (such as chicken, turkey, or hummus), salads, vegetable sticks, yogurt, cheese, fresh fruits (like apples, berries, or bananas), and whole grain crackers.

We ask that each child also brings a bottle of water—clearly labelled with their name—so staff can easily identify it. Students are encouraged to keep their water bottles accessible throughout the day, in the classroom, lunch hall, and playground. Please note that juices of any kind are not permitted.*
