

JULY 25, 2023 RED RIVER RETENTION AUTHORITY FLOOD IMPACTS SURVEY

The Red River Retention Authority (RRRA) is a joint powers board comprised of the Red River Watershed Management Board in Minnesota and the Red River Joint Water Resource District in North Dakota. The primary objective of the RRRA is to ensure joint, comprehensive, and strategic coordination of retention projects in the Red River of the North watershed and facilitating implementation and construction of water retention in the Red River Basin (RRB).
