

I said, Unfortunately, I thought they viewed the Lodge as a place where they were to be served and catered to rather than their Elks Home. She said, "You know, if we could get our members to treat this place as their home, We would almost never need community service here".

Celebrating our 50th Anniversary

Institution of Northglenn Lodge April 26, 1970

The Northglenn Elks Lodge was instituted on April 26, 1970. We would like to share the prologue from that ceremony.

Prologue

A little over ten years ago Perl-Mack Construction Company built their first model homes, in what is now Northglenn, at 104th Place and Grant, located 8 miles north of Denver on Interstate Highway 25. People driving out from Denver to look at the new homes felt they were really getting out into the country. The clear air and suburban way of life make Northglenn an ideal place to live. Long's Peak and the mountains to the west during the ever changing seasons provide a spectacular view.

Northglenn has over 8,000 homes and a population of 28,000 people. In 1964 the community was filed for incorporation as the City of North Glenn, two words. After a lengthy court battle, the city was incorporated in March of 1969 as Northglenn. The original group of citizens interested in forming the city was known as the Civic Association later to become the Northglenn activists. The first city election was held in March of 1969. The first city officials worked without pay as Northglenn did not have any tax income until the first of 1970.

In August of 1969 a group of men headed by New Lodge Committee Chairman Ed Klipka along with Jerry Connolly, John Prunk and James Steers thought the new city of Northglenn should have an Elks Lodge. The brotherhood of an Elks Lodge and the Civic Service could surely fit into our new city.

On September 25, 1969, after a few preliminary meetings in James Steers' basement, the first official organizational meeting for the new Elks Lodge was held in Northglenn Mall Community room. At this time, Lodge Committee Chairman Ed Klipka, along with Jerry Connolly, John Prunk and George Wright stepped in to guide us to this institution day.
