



Celebrating our 50th Anniversary... Flag Day

The Northglenn Lodge has a proud history of performing the Flag Day Service. Most could not attend this year so we included the history of the Flag as part of this month's Banner.



(Taken from the Flag Day Service; B.P.O.E. Rituals of Special Services). From Left to Right:

- 1. In 1775 the Pine Tree Flag was adopted for all colonial vessels.
- 2. The Southern colonies carried the **Snake Flag** from 1776 to 1777
- 3. In 1775 the Continental Congress appointed a committee to consider a design of 13 alternating stripes of red and white with an azure field in the upper corner bearing the red cross of St. George. This flag was hoisted to the masthead on the flagship "Alfred" on December 3, 1775 and one month later it was raised over the headquarters of General Washington at Cambridge Massachusetts.
- 4. This flag was called "The Continental Colors" and the "Grand Union". While this was never used by Continental Land Forces, the Navy used it exclusively and was the first American Flag to receive a salute of honor. Congress provided the following on June 14, 1777: "That the Flag of the United States be thirteen stripes of alternating red and white; and that the union be thirteen stars, white on a blue field, representing a new constellation."
- 5. It is generally believed that in May or June of 1776 a committee commissioned Betsy Ross to make a flag from a rough design they left with her. This flag first flew at Fort Stanwix near the city of Rome New York, on August 3, 1777.

The original thirteen Stars and Stripes represented the original thirteen colonies. In 1795 two additional Stars and Stripes were added to represent admission to the Union of Vermont and Kentucky. Under this banner of fifteen Stars and Stripes was fought the War of 1812. It was the sight of it flying over Fort McHenry, on September 14, 1814, that inspired Francis Scott Key to write what was to become our national anthem, "The Star-Spangled Banner."

- 6. The Congress on April 14, 1818, adopted a resolution that on and after July 4, 1818, the number of stripes should be thirteen and that the blue field should carry one star for each of the twenty states in the union and that a new star should be added for each state thereafter admitted.
- 7. Since 1818, there has been no change in the Flag design except that twenty-eight new stars were added before July 4, 1912, and this Flag of forty-eight stars flew over this nation for forty-seven years until just before the Vietnam War.
- 8. On July 4, 1959, a star was added for Alaska, our first non-connected state and a year later, Hawaii, our island state added a fiftieth star. Our present Flag fifty stars and thirteen stripes. It is accompanied by the POW-MIA Flag to recognize the plight and demise of a special group of our Armed Services, those who were prisoners of war or still remain missing in action.
