

Did you Know...

I have been asked to explain the difference parts of the how the Lodge operates. Last month we explored How the Lodge is Governed. This month we will look into RESTRICTED FUNDS.

There are 2 types of funds temporary or permanent. Temporary funds are defined as funds donated or raised for a specified purpose, Those funds can only be used for the designated purpose. Permanent funds samples are ENF, Craft Show, Funeral, etc. and a Lodge may not borrow from, or against any such property without written authorization of the donor(creator) for a purpose or during a period other than designated.

Restricted Funds are covered in the Statutes Book Sec.1.165 or 16.011 and also in the Auditing and Accounting Manual 3-117, or you can get together with the Lodge Secretary or Lodge Treasurer to answer any questions you may have.

Rovin' Corks Camping Schedule 2021

Below is the Rovin' Corks Camping Schedule for 2021. Notifications will be sent out before each campout with instructions how to sign up for that campout. We invite Lodge members to camp with us. If you would like to be added to the notification list, please call me. We do have fun times and really, really great food! Tents and all rig sizes and types are fine in most locations. Some locations have cabins. Please feel free to call me, (303) 452-3034, to sign up for informational e-mails for a campout, or for any additional information you may need.



Weekend of May 1, Fort Collins/KOA Lakeside, Fort Collins (full hookups)

We have a block of sites reserved under Northglenn Elks. In order to confirm a site, you would need to call them at 970-484-9880, give them your arrival and departure dates, and pay a deposit of around \$50, depending on your site. The deadline to do this is March 29.

Weekend of May 22, Riverview RV Park, Loveland (full hookups)

We have a block of sites reserved under Northglenn Elks. In order to confirm a site, you would need to call them at 970-667-9910, give them your arrival and departure dates, and pay a deposit of \$47.70. The deadline to do this is February 16, but they most likely will still have sites available in the loop we are in if you call them after the deadline.

Weekend of June 12, Parrish Ranch, Longmont (water and electricity only)

f you would like to join us at Parrish Ranch, please call me and I will add you to the list. This is not a formal campground. It is a beautiful area on a working ranch where camping is allowed. It is primitive, grassy, shady, and beautiful. There are teepees available to rent and tents are fine.

Weekend of July 4, Parrish Ranch, Longmont; Same as Parrish Ranch, above.

Weekend of July 24, Cherry Creek State Park, Aurora (full hookups)

Since this is a State Park, it is best if you make reservations 6 months in advance, therefore January 22, for a July 22, arrival date. Call the Reservations Center at 800-244-5613, or on line at cpwshop.com. There still may be sites available. We are in the Pioneer Loop. Camping is \$41 per night and you must have an Aspen Leaf pass or buy daily passes at \$11 per day.

Weekend of August 7, St. Vrain State Park, Longmont, (electricity only)

Again, this is a State Park, so reservations start 6 months in advance, therefore February 5, for August 5, arrival. There may be sites still available. Call the Reservations Center at 800-244-5613 or on line at cpwshop.com. We are in the Mallard Loop. Camping is \$36.00 per night and you must have an Aspen Leaf pass or buy daily passes at \$9.00 per day.

Weekend of August 21, Parrish Ranch, Longmont; Please see Parrish Ranch, above.

Weekend of September 11, Cherry Creek State Park, Aurora

This will be handled the same way as Cherry Creek State Park, above. For further information, please call. me.

Weekend of October 2, St. Vrain State Park, Longmont; This will be handled the same as St. Vrain State Park, above.

Celecbrate Flag Day

Patriotism has characterized the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America since the early days of the organization. Allegiance to the flag of our country is a requirement of every member. In 1907, the Grand Lodge of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks designated, by resolution, June 14 as Flag Day. The Grand Lodge of the Order adopted mandatory observance of the occasion by every Lodge in 1911, and that requirement continues. The Elks prompted President Woodrow Wilson to recognize the Order's observance of Flag Day for its patriotic expression. But it was not until 1949 when President Harry Truman, himself a member of the Elks, made the proclamation that thereafter June 14 would be a day of national observance for the symbol of our country. It was through his Elks Lodge in Independence, Missouri, that President Truman got the idea for a national observance of Flag Day

From the Lodge Historian

When was the last time you visited with a member who has been a member for 25 years, 30 years, 35 years, 40 years or more?

We have a few at the Lodge who have some pretty good stories to tell (some not printable) and some pretty funny ones.

I visited one morning with Joe Heger, Marion Holstine, and Tommy Lee Chambers. I found out that our Lodge started with a couple of information meetings in Jim Steers', PSP, PDD basement. From there went to the Northglenn Mall for a few more informational meetings and finally settled in Castaways Bar's basement for a few months. Then they moved to Eastlake just a couple of doors down from the Lake Street Tavern, across the street from the Post Office and Meat Locker. While they were in Eastlake a couple of member's kids used to put a bolt in the lock on the front door and lock them in, they would have to go out the back door and go around to open the front door. At this location there was a member who used to use the Lodge phone to call Ireland. That is why to this day no long distance phone calls can be made from the Lounge phones. They were pretty tight quarters for them so they looked for a place elsewhere when their rent was raised.

In 1974 the Lodge moved to The Warehouse. At this location is where the mysterious fire was in 1975 and did a lot of damage. Look over the Dining Room entrance next time you are at the Lodge, the \$ bill and all the coins were rescued from the fire.

Al Russell, PDD was the Exalted Ruler 1975-76 and he was a pilot. Joe Heger flew to Indianapolis with Joan for a Truck Rodeo that summer. Al Russell informed the stewardess that Joe was Chaplain at his Elks Lodge, so before they served dinner she came and asked Joe if he would like to give the Invocation, Joan was laughing so hard, as Joe stammered and told her "No Thank you".
