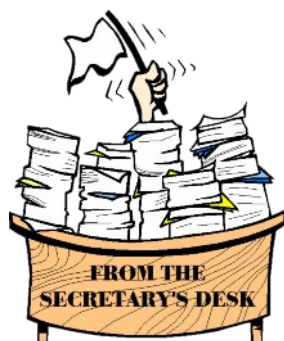
The Lodge members are working together to have a booth at the Adams County Fair, August 4-8, if you are willing to help please let me know ASAP.

Celebrate Flag Day

Patriotism has characterized the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America since the early days of the organization. Allegiance to the flag of our country is a requirement of every member. In 1907, the Grand Lodge of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks designated, by resolution, June 14 as Flag Day. The Grand Lodge of the Order adopted mandatory observance of the occasion by every Lodge in 1911, and that requirement continues. The Elks prompted President Woodrow Wilson to recognize the Order's observance of Flag Day for its patriotic expression. **But it was not until 1949 when President Harry Truman, himself a member of the Elks, made the proclamation that thereafter June 14 would be a day of national observance for the symbol of our country.** It was through his Elks Lodge in Independence, Missouri, that President Truman got the idea for a national observance of Flag Day

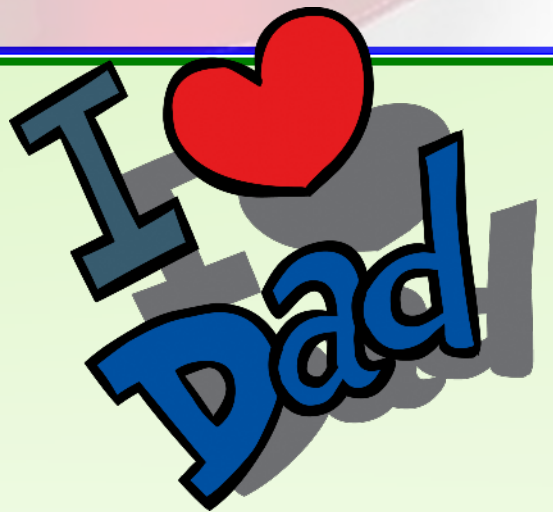

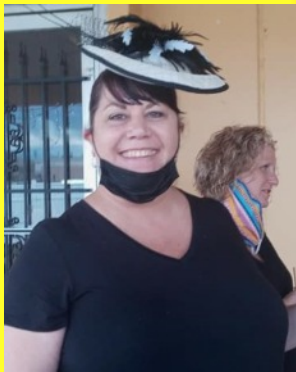

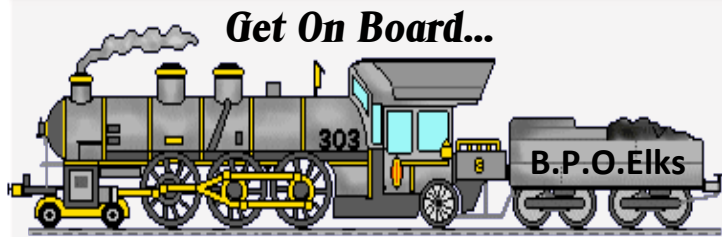

Rovin' Corks Camping Schedule 2021

Below is the Rovin' Corks Camping Schedule for 2021. Notifications will be sent out before each campout with instructions how to sign up for that campout. We invite Lodge members to camp with us. If you would like to be added to the notification list, please call me. We do have fun times and really, really great food! Tents and all rig sizes and types are fine in most locations. Some locations have cabins. Please feel free to call me, (303) 452-3034, to sign up for informational e-mails for a campout, or for any additional information you may need.



Weekend of June 12, Parrish Ranch, Longmont (water and electricity only)

If you would like to join us at Parrish Ranch, please call me and I will add you to the list. This is not a formal campground. It is a beautiful area on a working ranch where camping is allowed. It is primitive, grassy, shady, and beautiful. There are teepees available to rent and tents are fine.

Weekend of July 4, Parrish Ranch, Longmont; Same as Parrish Ranch, above.

Weekend of July 24, Cherry Creek State Park, Aurora (full hookups)

Since this is a State Park, it is best if you make reservations 6 months in advance, therefore January 22, for a July 22, arrival date. Call the Reservations Center at 800-244-5613, or on line at cpwshop.com. There still may be sites available. We are in the Pioneer Loop. Camping is \$41 per night and you must have an Aspen Leaf pass or buy daily passes at \$11 per day.

Weekend of August 7, St. Vrain State Park, Longmont, (electricity only)

Again, this is a State Park, so reservations start 6 months in advance, therefore February 5, for August 5, arrival. There may be sites still available. Call the Reservations Center at 800-244-5613 or on line at cpwshop.com. We are in the Mallard Loop. Camping is \$36.00 per night and you must have an Aspen Leaf pass or buy daily passes at \$9.00 per day.

Weekend of August 21, Parrish Ranch, Longmont; Please see Parrish Ranch, above.

Weekend of September 11, Cherry Creek State Park, Aurora

This will be handled the same way as Cherry Creek State Park, above. For further information, please call me.

Weekend of October 2, St. Vrain State Park, Longmont; This will be handled the same as St. Vrain State Park, above.

Updated COVID Guidelines as of May 16, 2021

Hello Members, families and friends. We hope everyone is safe and healthy in these challenging times. We continue having our regular meetings and monitor all recommendations as they become available. As most of you have probably heard, Adams County has moved to an "All Clear" status as of May 16th. What this means for us...

- We will remove the protective barrier at the bar.
- We will return the bar stools to the bar area.
- We will be allowed to operate at 100% capacity.

Mission Statement

To inculcate the principles of Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity; to recognize a belief in God; to promote the welfare and enhance the happiness of its Members; to quicken the spirit of American patriotism; to cultivate good fellowship; to perpetuate itself as a fraternal organization, and to provide for its government, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America will serve the people and communities through benevolent programs, demonstrating that Elks Care and Elks Share.



Evolution of the United States Flag

No one knows with **absolute certainty** who designed the first stars and stripes or who made it. Congressman [Francis Hopkinson](#) seems most likely to have designed it, and few historians believe that [Betsy Ross](#), a Philadelphia seamstress, made the first one.

Until the Executive Order of June 24, 1912, neither the order of the stars nor the proportions of the flag was prescribed. Consequently, flags dating before this period sometimes show unusual arrangements of the stars and odd proportions, these features being left to the discretion of the flag maker. In general, however, straight rows of stars and proportions similar to those later adopted officially were used. The principal acts affecting the flag of the United States are the following:

- On **June 14, 1777**, in order to establish an official flag for the new nation, the Continental Congress passed the **first Flag Act**: "Resolved, That the flag of the United States be made of thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new Constellation."
- Act of **January 13, 1794** - provided for 15 stripes and 15 stars after May 1795.
- Act of **April 4, 1818** - provided for 13 stripes and one star for each state, to be added to the flag on the 4th of July following the admission of each new state, signed by President Monroe.
- Executive Order of President Taft dated **June 24, 1912** - established proportions of the flag and provided for arrangement of the stars in six horizontal rows of eight each, a single point of each star to be upward.
- Executive Order of President Eisenhower dated **January 3, 1959** - provided for the arrangement of the stars in seven rows of seven stars each, staggered horizontally and vertically.
- Executive Order of President Eisenhower dated **August 21, 1959** - provided for the arrangement of the stars in nine rows of stars staggered horizontally and eleven rows of stars staggered vertically.
