



Weekend of July 4, Parrish Ranch, Longmont; Same as Parrish Ranch, above.

Weekend of July 24, Cherry Creek State Park, Aurora (full hookups)

Since this is a State Park, it is best if you make reservations 6 months in advance, therefore January 22, for a July 22, arrival date. Call the Reservations Center at 800-244-5613, or on line at cpwshop.com. There still may be sites available. We are in the Pioneer Loop. Camping is \$41 per night and you must have an Aspen Leaf pass or buy daily passes at \$11 per day.

Weekend of August 7, St. Vrain State Park, Longmont, (electricity only)

Again, this is a State Park, so reservations start 6 months in advance, therefore February 5, for August 5, arrival. There may be sites still available. Call the Reservations Center at 800-244-5613 or on line at cpwshop.com. We are in the Mallard Loop. Camping is \$36.00 per night and you must have an Aspen Leaf pass or buy daily passes at \$9.00 per day.

Weekend of August 21, Parrish Ranch, Longmont; Please see Parrish Ranch, above.

Weekend of September 11, Cherry Creek State Park, Aurora

This will be handled the same way as Cherry Creek State Park, above. For further information, please call. me.

Weekend of October 2, St. Vrain State Park, Longmont; This will be handled the same as St. Vrain State Park, above.

Lodge History

This is from a book created and published by Colorado Elks under the direction of Al Maggard, PSP and Ann Gremel. The effort of working together to save and rebuild our Lodge has created an even stronger feeling of family, one that has become the foundation of the Northglenn Elks #2438 Lodge as we work together united to Make Our Lodge Great Again!

"In August of 1969, Nine gentelmen met to discuss the possibility of formaing an Elks Lodge in the city of Northglenn, Colorado. Permission was quickly granted to begin the organizational process and in September of that year, 60 men met in the baswement oif the Northglenn Mall, located at I-25 and 104th Street (since razed) and elected Jim Steers as their organizational committee President.

In Mark of 1970 the Northglenn Elks found their first official home in Eastlake. In April 1970, James Steers, Exalted Ruler, Leading Kinght, Bud O'Leary; Loyal Knight Bill Cliff; Secretary Bob Cass; Treasurer Jack Morison; Esquire Pat O'Connell; Chaplain Howard Houts; and Inner Guard Bob Kerby were installed by the Officers of Westminster Lodge #2227 and Northglenn Elks #2438 became the 50th Elks Lodge in Colorado. Al Steers, John McKee, Tom Cox, Alex Lopez and Frank Hinkle were the first Trustee's.

With the members growing quickly it wasnt long before before #2438 began to dream. The3ir first goal was to find an even better home. They set a goal and worked hard to make it happen. So confident were they that someday they would realize their dream, they bought restaurant equipment from an eatery that was going out of business and stored it at Bunky Tolson's place. Finally in 1975 their dreams came true. The Lodge was moved to a warehouse (fondly referred to as the "warehouse" to this day) and completedly refurbished with the help of hard working members and their families. Before long their store of restaurant tables, chairs, barstools and various other supplies were put into place. At last they looked and felt like a real Elks Lodge.

Sadly, their celebration would be short lived. Later that same yar a fire (possibly an act of Arson) would destroy the interior of the newly occupied Lodge. Some doubted the little Lodge could survive such an event.

In record time, the Lodge was back and running. The fire had drawn the membership even closer than they were before. The effort of working to save the Lodge had crated an even stronger feeling of family, one that would become the foundation of the Northglenn Elks Lodge."
