





Attention Members

The following house rule was read at the Lodge meeting January 20 and will be voted on at the meeting on February 17, 2022

The Northglenn Lodge will be able to accept credit cards for Purchases at the Bar, Kitchen, RV Camping and Display cabinet. Cash is available for purchases at any other area including Raffles or Pickles at the ATM only. We are unable to provide cash back for any credit card purchases.

Our bartenders and servers are volunteer and do not get paid. If you wish to donate or "tip" The server or bartender, please do so as a donation prior to completing the sale.

In accordance with Grand Lodge Statutes, a member or guest will not be indebted to the Lodge. When using a Credit Card for payment, it is possible to pay your bill at the conclusion of your purchases with the following benefits:

- Cash or check related purchases will be paid for at the time of service.
- All Credit Card purchases made during your stay must be settled prior to your departure. A credit card or membership card will be held by the bartender for all non-cash or check related payments until your bill is settled.
- Transactions not settled at the end of the night will be settled using the credit card on file with a 15% donation.

We do not anticipate any concerns or problems with our membership and their conduct regarding Credit Card purchases. It is important to note the following guidelines for your consideration:


- If the Credit Card payment is declined, it is the responsible members obligation to settle any amount due prior to leaving the establishment.
- Leaving the establishment without paying in full is against Grand Lodge Statutes and may result in being called before the board and possibly losing all or part of your credit card privileges along with other penalties in accordance with Grand Lodge Statutes.
- In accordance with established House Rules, In the event that service is refused to an individual, all payments must be settled at that time.
- Members are responsible for all of their guests while visiting the Lodge. Members are also ultimately responsible for settlement of any purchases made by their guests.







The Elks and Patriotism

Since the earliest days of the Order, patriotism has been among the many hallmarks that make the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks stand out from other fraternal organizations. With a membership comprised entirely of U.S. citizens, the BPO Elks is committed to promoting the principles of individual freedom, opportunity, and dignity.

Korea and Vietnam

When war broke out in Korea in 1950, the Elks responded by sending the gift packs as they had done in World War II. In 1951 during the Korean War, the Secretary of Defense appealed to the Order for help in procuring blood for the wounded. Within a few months, the Elks

Lodges obtained more than half a million pints.

During the Vietnam War, the Elks again answered the call by beginning the Letters from Home campaign. Elks members from across the nation flooded these fine young men and women with letters expressing gratitude for the sacrifices they were making on behalf of the nation. In addition to the letters, the Order provided care packages to soldiers.

Operation Desert Storm

As in previous conflicts, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks was ready to aid the men and women of the U.S. armed forces. Once again, the Elks mounted a letter-writing campaign to thank these patriots for their dedicated service, and gift packs for soldiers were provided as had been done in the past.

At the close of the Gulf War, many Elks Lodges made arrangements to host ceremonies honoring the brave soldiers returning from the conflict in the Middle East, making the Order one of the first organizations to formally welcome these veterans home.

Through these programs and many others, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks has truly established itself as a leading force in promoting the values that help shape and strengthen the United States.
