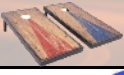

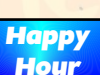

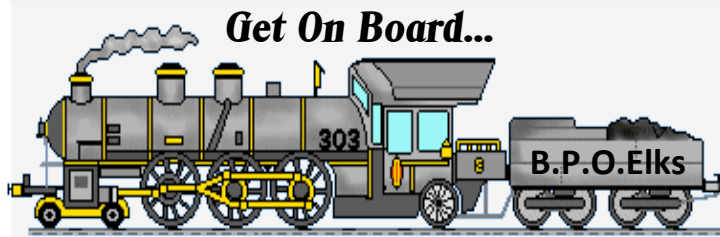

Attention Members:

A motion was made to amend the following house rule. The vote will take place on September 18 at the regular Lodge Meeting. Members must be present to vote on this change. House Rule #11 currently states:

Guns are not permitted on the property outside of your personal vehicle. Members and guest will not carry guns or weapons, of any type, while on the property of Northglenn Elks Lodge #2438. Members and guests carrying weapons should secure them in their vehicle prior to entering the Lodge.

The proposed change would eliminate House Rule #11 meaning the Lodge would follow the State of Colorado and the City of Northglenn current laws.

Colorado law allows a person to possess a handgun in a dwelling, place of business, or automobile. However, when you carry the weapon into your home, business, hotel room, etc. it must be in plain view. [C.R.S. 18-12-105.6] The Act permits the nationwide carrying of concealed handguns by qualified law enforcement officers and those who carry a conceal carry permit recognized by the State of Colorado.

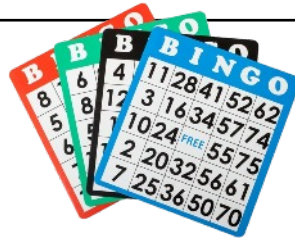

History of the Northglenn Elks

A little over sixty five years ago Perl-Mack Construction Company built their first model homes, in what is now Northglenn, at 104th Place and Grant, located 8 miles north of Denver on Interstate Highway 25. People driving out from Denver to look at the new homes felt they were really getting out into the country. The clear air and suburban way of life made Northglenn an ideal place to live. Long's Peak and the mountains to the west during the ever-changing seasons provide a spectacular view.

In August of 1969, a group of men headed by New Lodge Committee Chairman Ed Klipka along with Jerry Connolly, John Prunk and James Steers thought the new city of Northglenn should have an Elks Lodge. The brotherhood of an Elks Lodge and the Civic Service could surely fit into our new city.

On September 25, 1969, after a few preliminary meetings in James Steers' basement, the first official organizational meeting for the new Elks Lodge was held in Northglenn Mall Community room. At this time, Lodge Committee Chairman Ed Klipka, along with Jerry Connolly, John Prunk and George Wright stepped in to guide us to the institution day on April 26, 1970.

Our first home was in East Lake, CO. We rented a building across the street from the Post Office. The walls were covered in red wallpaper with gold designs and the secretary's office was a trailer in the back part of the property. There were several "fixer upper" opportunities here. We hosted our first Inaugural Ball and Installation of Officers along with several other events in this location.

As our Lodge continued to grow, we continued to look for a new location. In 1973 we purchased equipment from a restaurant and bar going out of business auction and we found space in a warehouse located on 112th just east of Irma Drive. This would be our home until we purchased City Hall that Northglenn had vacated for their new home on Community Center Drive.

While in the Warehouse, we settled in and really became a permanent part of the community. Our Charitable activities continued to grow funded by our members, our bingo sessions and the Elks National Foundation. In 1974 we survived a setback when there was a fire and no insurance. Everyone banded together again to rebuild our home and continue to move forward.

In 1981 we purchased the building that we currently call home. Finally, in 1983 the building that once was the Northglenn City Hall would be transformed into what it is today. The mortgage had been purchased by our membership and we paid 10% interest on the notes held against our building. In 1999 with significant help from our Ladies Auxiliary Organization, we were able to pay off the notes and we finally owned the building outright.

The Northglenn Lodge has always believed in supporting and working alongside the community. Our first Christmas Basket Deliveries were in 1969 before we were actually a Lodge. That program continues today as we strive to provide over 100 Christmas baskets to our community every year. We did not stop there. Over the years we have been involved in such programs as HAWC (Help abused women and children), Haunted House and several benefits and Community Welfare activities. We remain strong supporters of our veterans over the years through concert fund raisers for Comforts of Home, ditty bags, homeless veteran assistance and through the Fisher House activities. We have reached out to the schools with our dictionary programs, drug awareness programs, Clem Audin relief fund and Hoop Shoot. In addition to what our Lodge gives directly, this year alone we qualified for \$11,000.00 of grants from Elks National Foundation to be used in our community. Our state program also provides funds to Laradon Hall each year as our states major project.
